Centering Prayer

Preparation:

- 1. Set aside time where you know you will be undisturbed for the desired length of time.
- Light a candle or put a cross or something in front of you or in your hands to help keep you focused on the sacred.
- 3. Have an egg timer, watch alarm, phone alarm, or some simple way to let you know when your time is up.
- 4. Sit upright or lay flat on your back, but keep your spine straight so that you will not have to work at staying alert or staying in that position for a while.

Prayer:

- 1. Make the sign of the cross and start breathing slowly, relaxing all your joints and muscles. Breathe deeply and slowly so that it become effortless
- 2. Pray the Jesus Prayer. "Lord Jesus Christ, have mercy on me."
- 3. While you are inhaling say in your mind: "Lord Jesus Christ". Then as you exhale say in your mind: "have mercy on me." One can imagine Jesus filling your heart with each breath.
- 4. If you get distracted or notice that you are notice that your mind has wandered and that you are no longer saying the Jesus Prayer just resume your focus on breathing in rhythm with the prayer. Some like to have a pen and paper nearby to write down something that is distracting them that they need to do later. This will assure you that you won't forget about it later, so that you can focus on Jesus.
- 5. When your time is concluded, pray a Glory Be, or Our Father, or some other prayer of your choosing. Then conclude with the sign of the cross.

- 3. The following finger is the tallest. It reminds us of our leaders, the governors and those who have authority. They need God's guidance.
- 4. The fourth finger is the ring finger. Even though it may surprise you, it is our weakest finger. It should remind us to pray for the weakest, the sick or those plagued by problems. They need your prayers.
- 5. And finally we have our smallest finger, the smallest of all. Your pinkie should remind you to pray for yourself. When you ate done praying for the other four groups, you will be able to see your own needs but in the proper perspective, and also you will be able to pray for your own needs in a better way.
