phrase When you're lonely, Jesus Rescues!


On Day 2, Bible Discovery was transformed into Mary and Martha's home (Luke 10:38-42) to teach us *When you worry*,

Sound System Tune Up

This week we asked Rose City Sound engineers to give our church sound system a "tune up" to improve the balance and coverage through the seating area. Here is a photo of

the equipment they brought in to test and balance the signals through our main speakers. The tune up involved pushing white noise through each speaker and then balancing the sound waves. It was fascinating to watch them work!

Over the last few months, a number of parishioners have come up to me to say that they had a difficult time hearing the singers, musicians or priests at Mass. I



have noticed troubles as well. Also, as we have added more instruments at 9 AM and 11:30, sometimes it is an adventure to balance the sound through all the church.

Look up and notice that there are two speakers overhead – the rear speaker is on a millisecond "delay" from the front speaker, which causes a few problems when things get out of balance. That's one of the troubles Rose City discovered this week. They also adjusted the sound to account for the new carpeting in the sanctuary, which also had an impact on the reverberation and time delay.

The tune up was successful in improving the overall balance and frequency response. Our sound system was installed some years ago, however, and technology has greatly improved since then. So, there is a limit to what sound improvements can be made until we can update our speakers. For example, many of you have noticed the "sound shadow" in pews two and three, where the overhead speaker just doesn't reach. You will always need wait to hear the actual sound to fill in when sitting there.

Hearing Assist System

Our hearing assist system is also in need of upgrade. The current transmitter is still crystal technology and the newer digital units would greatly improve coverage and consistency. We will be looking into that improvement in the coming year.

Finally, here is an invitation to adults and teens who would like to help monitor sound at our Masses. One simple improvement we always can make is to have someone in the middle of the church listening and adjusting. Let me know if you can help us with that on a regular basis. It's easy – but greatly appreciated!

My Long Journey to the Catholic Church By Kasey Macsenti

I grew up as a half-hearted Methodist in the Colorado Rockies. I found communion with God easier in the great outdoors, rather than inside a church. Sunday school was particularly difficult. Adults telling bible stories with felt cut-outs over-simplified it and the stories always left me feeling a bit empty and confused. But in the wide-open spaces, God was always near. However, my disinterest in church stunted my religious growth until moving to Oregon in 1988. As a high school junior, I re-found my faith, became 'born again,' and was baptized at a Beaverton bible church. Suddenly, I was very interested. I studied, went to bible college, learned to read Greek, and started holding discussion groups to work through the more difficult topics of our day. Christianity became very relevant to me... and I was keenly aware of its abilities to help people work through their questions and to find a more solid footing in life.

But as time passed in the 1990s, I started sensing a widening gap from my newly found Christian Evangelical community and my own convictions. With each passing year, I found myself focusing on philosophy over theology. My discussion groups turned to the great thinkers of Western Culture, and away from biblical scholars. I could sense that I was living my Christianity in a faith-vacuum, distanced from my evangelical community. Although I didn't feel like I was moving towards something at the time, I now see that I was actually being drawn...I was being called to become a Catholic.

Some important events occurred that recaptured my interest in religious studies. I married a Catholic, spent more time studying Catholic theologians, and ended up at Our Lady of the Lake. These past few years have provided a wonderful awakening for me. Last year I started RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) with excitement and many questions. Some of the questions

still remain, but the Sacraments have captured my imagination and once again I find myself excited to be a believer in Christ. The Sacraments of Confession and Communion provided an anchor that I had not experienced in a long time.
