Our Parish Health Ministry: What We Do and Why We Do It

“Do you not know that our bodies are Temples of the Holy Spirit.”
 1 Corinthians 6:19

For nearly seven years our Parish Health Ministry has been working quietly within the walls of this church. Many of you may not even know what the ministry is or even why we have one. We see many examples in the scriptures of Christ healing powers and His compassion for those who are struggling physically, emotionally and spiritually. Our Lady of the Lake Health Ministry offers a way for us to live Christ’s example. So we continue the healing ministry of Jesus.

“Life and physical health are precious gifts from God. We must take reasonable care of them, taking into account the needs of others and the common good.” (CCC No. 2288)

In the Health Ministry, we see ourselves as integrators of faith and healing. We provide care that is spiritually-focused in a faith community—bringing together faith and health, spirituality and healing. This does not require medical expertise or a theological degree. It just calls for plain old “being there.” Presence is important when it comes to healing. It’s not the kiss on a boo-boo that comforts the child, it is the presence of his mother; someone whom he knows who loves and cares for him. The same is true with the Health Ministry: just your presence is required, no knowledge or special skill.

The Health Ministry often receives calls for someone to transport a homebound parishioner to Sunday Mass (*Soul Wellness*) or, for someone to be a second pair of ears at a doctor’s appointment (*Emotional Wellness*). No special certification needed here, except for maybe a drivers license.

In the Health Ministry, a human relationship becomes a holy one. At OLL we are immersed in a community with not only

physical needs but also emotional and spiritual needs. When we comfort a soul in need with attentiveness we also lift our own soul to be closer in union with God. For example, a long time Health Ministry member who reads to a severely disabled parishioner once a week explains that she enjoys the “quietness of it”. Her joy, she says, is when he responds. She knows that she has connected with him just by the simple act of reading to him. She may just consider this a “holy relationship.”

Another example you may remember, “Walk to Jerusalem” was one of our most popular programs, with over 200 participants each year. The bringing together of physical exercise, prayer, and a brief geography lesson of each leg of the journey provided a merging of body, soul, and mind wellness.

Like all other ministries we always have room for new members. We have many different programs available to parishioners. Most require one to two hours per month. For instance, our Blood Pressure Clinic consists of RN’s, PA’s, or MD’s with active licenses who volunteer after the morning Masses on the second Sunday of each month.

We are also looking for someone to take the lead in organizing and overseeing the programs under the Health Ministry umbrella. The groundwork for all our current and past programs has been completed and we just need someone to take the lead! We are always in search of new ideas and a fresh perspective to keep our Health Ministry viable and in sync with our parishioners.

Singing the Mass of Spirit and Grace

Starting this weekend and continuing through the fall and winter Ordinary Time, we will begin singing the *Mass of Spirit and Grace* for our acclamations at all Masses. The composer, Fr. Ricky Manalo, is a Paulist priest who was named the 2018 Liturgical Composer of the Year by the National Association of Pastoral Musicians.

Fr. Manalo and has composed a number of songs in our repertoire, including *The God of All Grace* – musically the basis of this Mass setting. *Mass of Spirit and Grace* celebrates the mystery of the Holy Spirit with strong and approachable melodies that help us reflect upon our lives with Christ.

Our Music Team liked that *Mass of Spirit and Grace* combines a traditional style with a contemporary sound, giving it the flexibility to be used at all Masses in a similar style to the *Mass of Renewal* which we have sung primarily since the adoption of the Roman Missal, Third Edition. We find its melodies intuitively singable and hope it will be easy for you to “pray” well in the coming months. New parishioners and visitors regularly comment on how well our congregation sings!

We will continue to sing the *Glory to God* settings we have used during the summer. In the next two weeks we will introduce the chant-styled *Glory to God* from the Belmont Mass that we sing during Advent. We hope this new setting is also one that can be used throughout the year for weekday feasts and solemnities. As always, we welcome your feedback.



September Health Notes

September is National Cholesterol Education Month. Americans of all ages are susceptible to developing high cholesterol. It is important for everyone to learn what your cholesterol level means. This month, take time to have your cholesterol checked. Take steps to lower it if it is high.

To find out your cholesterol levels, ask your doctor to do a blood test called a lipoprotein profile to find out. It will measure your total cholesterol levels, including LDL (“bad” cholesterol), HDL (“good” cholesterol), and triglycerides. All adults should have cholesterol levels checked every 5 years. Less than half of young adults who have other risk factors have cholesterol screening. These risk factors include obesity, smoking, high blood pressure, diabetes, and family history.

This is also a good month to learn about food and lifestyle choices that help you reach personal cholesterol goals. In America, more than 102 million adults have cholesterol levels that are above healthy levels. More than 35 million of these people have levels which puts them at high risk for heart disease.

- \$39.99 For quadrivalent vaccine (no insurance).
- High dose vaccine for those 65 years and over is available for \$76.99 if you are not on medicare. (Medicare does cover high dose vaccine).
- **Co-pays should be paid with exact change or check.**
- Vaccinations are available for those 7 years of age or older. No flu mist available this year.

Operation Overcoat – Saturday, September 28 – help distribute clothing and food to the homeless of downtown Portland.


