Anointing of the Sick

Then Jesus called the twelve together and gave them power and authority over all demons and to cure diseases, and he sent them out to proclaim the kingdom of God and to heal.” - Luke 9:1-2

During his ministry on earth, Jesus had a particular concern for sick people; he healed them not just with a word of power, but also with a human and compassionate touch.

The Anointing of the Sick, like all sacraments, is one way that the church continues the ministry of Jesus. Through it, Christ continues to touch, heal, and comfort. The Letter of James attests that this practice has always been part of ministry: “*Is anyone among you sick? He should summon the presbyters of the church, and they should pray over him and anoint [him] with oil in the name of the church.*” (5:14).

The sacrament may be received by a baptized person who “begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age,” according to the Catechism of the Catholic Church (1514)—seriously ill, but not necessarily near death—so it may not be apparent that someone receiving the sacrament is ill. The communal celebration reminds us that suffering is part of our human condition and may move us to look on each other with the compassion of Christ the healer.

Anointing of the Sick is offered for anyone who is currently or chronically ill or with disabilities including mental illnesses or conditions, persons anticipating a surgery, or who have a terminal illness such as cancer. The sacrament is also offered to the elderly, especially those with limited mobility. The Sacrament may be received more than once.

This sacrament was once called extreme unction (meaning final anointing) because it had, over time, come to be reserved for the dying. The Second Vatican Council renamed it “anointing of the sick” to describe its appropriate place in

the life of the Christian faithful: to offer strength and healing in time of serious illness. In the case of anointing a person near death, it is often accompanied by the sacraments of reconciliation (if possible) and viaticum (holy communion for the dying).

Does the sacrament heal? Yes. Is the healing physical? It is certainly what we hope for when we celebrate this sacrament, but we cannot approach it with this expectation. We pray that the Holy Spirit may give strength, peace, and courage to the sick to help them face the difficulties of illness and age with faith and hope.

Requesting Mass Intentions

One way we can “remember” our loved ones who have died is by asking for a Mass to be offered in their memory. This is often referred to as requesting a “Mass Intention” or a Mass Card. We do this because our Catholic faith is centered on the Holy Eucharist where we come together for renewal in Christ. Very often the family members will make it a point to attend the Mass on that requested day to remember their loved one.

What is a Mass Intention?

From the very beginnings of the Church, it was customary for the faithful to donate the bread and wine to be used in the celebration of the Holy Eucharist. In time, offerings of money were substituted for the actual bread and wine. Money given in excess of what was necessary for the procuring of the bread and wine was used to assist the poor and, eventually, to support the clergy. Thus, it became customary for the priest to accept a “stipend” from the faithful in return for remembering a specific intention in the celebration of a Mass.

All Mass Intentions are voluntary offerings, since the Holy Eucharist is the universal prayer of all the church. The typical offering is ten dollars. The Code of Canon Law notes that the petitioner also benefits: “Christ’s faithful who make an offering so that Mass can be celebrated for their intention contribute to the good of the Church, and by that offering they share in the Church’s concern for the support of its ministers and its activities” (Canon 946).

Mass Intentions at Our Lady of the Lake

Mass Intentions can be requested for the living or for the deceased. When you request a Mass Intention at Our Lady of the Lake, you may also receive a Mass Card to send to comfort relatives, friends and loved ones. We are happy to mail the Mass Card directly to the person, if living, for whose intention the Mass will be offered, or to a family member of the deceased.

You may request a Mass Intention on our parish website (www.olparish.com/intentions) or you can call ahead or email the parish with the necessary information and the card will be ready for you to pick up when needed.

In order to fairly accommodate all Mass Intentions requested given priest availability at OLL, we ask that no more than three intentions per family be made per each quarter (approximately one per month.) You may request additional Mass intentions, but we will not be able to place them on the schedule until we have updated daily Mass schedules. Thanks for your understanding of this limitation so we can avoid rescheduling Mass intentions. Please contact the parish office if you have additional questions.

Human life is good and to be protected. All medical decisions ought to reflect this core belief. Yet some medical and legal documents used to define a patient's future care can be harmful. No matter how well-crafted, they can't predict all the possible scenarios and best courses of action. In each set of circumstances, we need to judge whether a given treatment will provide real benefit to the patient, without causing harm or disproportionate burdens. The safest option is to designate a health care agent to make decisions if you become incapable of doing so. It's best to appoint a responsible, trustworthy person who understands and shares your Catholic values, and can apply them when the need arises.
