The Baptism of the Lord: *Following Jesus*

Today the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Baptism of Our Lord. This brings to an end the season of Christmas and recalls Our Lord's second manifestation or "epiphany" which occurred on the occasion of His baptism in the Jordan.

The Baptism of Jesus manifests the very life of the Holy Trinity to the whole world and opens the door, through Jesus Christ, into a "communion" and a participation in the life of the Trinity through Baptism into His Body, the Church. The waters of the Jordan are sanctified by the Son and now all water is sanctified. Just as the Spirit hovered over the waters of the original creation, the Spirit hovers over the waters where the Son is immersed by John.

One of the first elements of creation fashioned by the Father through the Son, is now re-created through the Incarnate Son. Jesus, the Incarnate Word, stands in the waters of the earth which was created through Him. Into these waters, through which the people of Israel were once delivered, the entire human race is now invited to follow Jesus.

The Feast of the "Theophany", the Baptism in the Jordan celebrates the full salvation and sanctification of all

matter as well. The Greek word for "Baptism" means to be immersed. Before it is all over, the entire world will be "immersed" in God and transformed. It will be freed from sin and made new!

Descending into the waters of the Jordan, Jesus, who shares our humanity, makes that living water flow with healing mercy. His Divine Life is now mediated through the Sacraments in the life of the Church which is His Body. The Word descends and begins the re-creation of the universe.

This is an ongoing work which will only be complete when He returns. We who are baptized into Him are called to participate in this ongoing redemptive mission. The public mission and ministry of Jesus began at the waters of Jordan. However, it continues through His Church, of which we are made members through Baptism.

Will we follow Jesus? Will we allow His will to "be done in me" as our Blessed Mother declared to the Angel Gabriel? As we conclude this Christmas season, each of us is reminded once again of our opportunity to grow deeper in our commitment to love and serve the Lord. If you are waiting for the right moment... it's already here.

Fr. John's 30 Day Retreat

As I (*Fr. John Kerns*) have mentioned on a few occasions, I will be away from the parish from January 13 until February 16 to make a 30-day silent retreat on the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius.

It will officially take place from January 15 to February 15 at a Venice, Florida retreat center operated by the Oblates of the Virgin Mary (OMV). This religious order was founded to promote retreats and Ignatian Spirituality as a means of conversion and spiritual growth. Conversion is a life-long spiritual journey. That is, conversion might initially be seen as giving one's life to Christ at a key moment in time, but we are also called to be engaged in the growth of that relationship for our entire life in this world, and the world to come.

The Spiritual Exercises are only one aspect of Ignatian Spirituality which is most often associated with the Jesuit order of priests and brothers founded in 1534 by St. Ignatius of Loyola. But its approach to being a disciple of Jesus Christ can be embraced by anyone. In fact, St. Ignatius desired for anyone and everyone – ordained, married, single, religious – to make the 30-day retreat. He experienced it naturally in his initial conversion process, but then he designed it and improved upon it all his life for the sake of anyone who desires to know and serve Christ, especially the members of his order. Some use it for discernment of what God wants them to do in life, career, or vocation. Others, like me, seek it for a deepening of that call to discipleship. The key question I am taking into this retreat is to ask God, in light of my role as a baptized disciple, a priest of the Archdiocese of Portland, and in this assignment as the pastor of Our Lady of the Lake: "How do you want to use me to accomplish your will?"

The primary way of experiencing the Spiritual Exercises is on a 30-Day retreat. But there are also methods for those who can't block out that kind of time. These meet weekly or monthly over 10 weeks or 9 months. These are often called the Spiritual Exercises in Everyday Life (SEEL).

For myself I am grateful that we priests, like other professional roles, are allotted time and funding for retreats and continuing education. I'm doing a combination of that for my 30 days away. Please keep me in your prayers for my retreat to be fruitful in my spiritual growth. I will be sure to pray for you, as I already do.

This presentation will be given by two healthcare professionals from our parish, Dr. Grace Jazrawi and Megan Kreft, who specialize in the practice of CrMS and NaProTECHNOLOGY. Creighton Model System is a natural model where a woman or couple learns to track signs of her fertility, therefore being able to achieve or avoid pregnancy. CrMS is used in NaProTECHNOLOGY, a premiere women's health science, to diagnosis and treat various underlying women's health issues such as infertility, irregular cycles, recurrent miscarriage, ovarian cysts, PMS, and endometriosis.

January Health Notes: January is Thyroid Awareness Month. An estimated 20 million Americans have some form of thyroid disease. Nearly 60% of those with the disease are unaware of their condition. Women are 5 to 8 times more likely to have thyroid problems. The causes of thyroid problems are unknown.

The thyroid gland is located in the middle of the lower neck. This small gland produces an essential hormone. Hypothyroidism is a condition where the gland produces insufficient amounts of this hormone. Symptoms include fatigue, depression, forgetfulness and weight gain.

Another form of the disease, hyperthyroidism, causes the gland to produce too much hormone. Sufferers may experience irritability, nervousness, muscle weakness, weight loss, sleep issues and vision problems. Graves' disease, an autoimmune disorder, is a genetic form of hyperthyroidism.

Coping with Life Alone in the Beginning


