Word of God Sunday — Bring Your Bibles!

On the Feast of St. Jerome this past fall, Pope Francis dedicated the Third Sunday of Ordinary Time as **Word of God Sunday**. The first celebration of this annual day will be next Sunday, on January 26, 2020. We invite you to bring your personal or family Bible to Mass with you for a special blessing and commendation.

In his decree, "Aperuit Illis," the Holy Father said, "He opened their minds to understand the Scriptures" (Lk 24:45). This was one of the final acts of the risen Lord before his Ascension.

Jesus appeared to the assembled disciples, broke bread with them and opened their

minds to the understanding

of the sacred Scriptures.

To them, amid their fear and bewilderment, he unveiled the meaning of the paschal mystery: that in accordance with the Father's eternal plan he had to suffer and rise from the dead, in order to bring repentance and the forgiveness of sins (cf. Lk 24:26.46-47). He then promised to send the Holy Spirit, who would give them strength to be witnesses of this saving mystery (cf. Lk 24:49)."

The relationship between the Risen Lord, the community of believers and sacred Scripture is essential to our identity as Christians. Without the Lord who *opens our minds to them*, it is impossible to understand the Scriptures in depth.


Yet the contrary is equally true: without the Scriptures, the events of the mission of Jesus and of his Church in this world would remain incomprehensible."

The Holy Father continues, "Regular reading of sacred Scripture and the celebration of the Eucharist make it possible for us to see ourselves as part of one another. As Christians, we are a single people, making our pilgrim way through history, sustained

by the Lord, present in our midst, who speaks to us and nourishes us."

Pope Francis

suggested that on 'Word of God' Sunday, the Bible be enthroned "in order to focus our attention on the normative value of God's Word and to encourage us to read the Bible as a regular part of our daily lives."

In keeping with his admonition, we invite everyone coming to Mass next weekend – January 25-26 – to bring your personal or family Bible with you. After the homily at each Mass, we will have a special blessing and commendation of these bibles. Additional Bible resources will be available for enthroning scriptures in your home. Flu Season Precautions

Flu season is upon us, as many of you know, and perhaps have already experienced personally or in your family. While we always want to encourage attendance at Mass, and a spirit of hospitality, all of us should also take necessary precautions to not transmit a cold or the flu if we are ill.

The Archdiocesan Office of Divine Worship offers these recommendations to guide our approach to the celebration of Mass and the sacraments, and especially the reception of Holy Communion. Our Lady of the Lake parish will continue offering Holy Communion under both species, however:

- 1. Those who are not feeling well should refrain from receiving from the chalice and should receive Holy Communion under the form of bread alone to avoid transmitting any illness.
- 2. Due to the fact that our hands are often transmitters of the cold and flu, care should be taken:
 - a. Never self-intinct (dip) the consecrated host into the Precious Blood.
 - b. If you are ill, in place of the regular way of offering the sign of peace, a nod of the head and a verbal greeting of peace rather than the shaking of hands during this cold and flu season may be used.
 - c. Holding hands during the Our Father is discouraged.
- 3. Those who are Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion in the parish church or those involved in ministry to the homebound should take special precautions. They should heed all health directives by frequently washing their hands and avoiding contact with others, especially those most susceptible to illness.
- 4. Catholics who are ill are excused from Sunday worship out of respect and concern for their fellow worshipers. Catholics who are ill may make a spiritual communion during the time of their illness.







Join hundreds of Oregonians at the steps of the Oregon Capitol, marking 47 years of nationally-legal abortion. The events will begin at 2:15 PM with the March for Life immediately following. Each year on January 22, all dioceses in the United States are called to observe a Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children. January 22 is the anniversary of the 1973 Supreme Court decisions that legalized abortion throughout our nation. Since then, over 60 million lives have been lost. That's more than the size of Italy's population.

This coming Wednesday, we set aside a day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life. It is also a day of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion. We are each called to observe this day through the penitential practices of prayer, fasting and/or giving alms.

The act of abortion rejects God's gift of life. Abortion destroys the life of a child, lovingly knit together in his or her mother's womb, and for someone who has participated in abortion, the loss of a child can form a hole in their heart so deep that sometimes it seems nothing can fill the emptiness. As a human and Christian family, we grieve the loss of so many lives. And yet, even in our grief, we know there is hope.

If you or someone you know is suffering after abortion, confidential, compassionate help is available.
