Jesus' Invitation: A Matter of Faith


In this week's Gospel passage, Jesus invites Peter to come to him on the "troubled" waters and to not be afraid. Peter takes the first steps but then, of course, his doubt takes over and he begins to sink. After Jesus rescues him, Peter once again acknowledges the Son of God's presence in the midst of the storm.

It doesn't take much for us to see the immediate similarities between Peter and the other disciples' storm and our own current life situations as an opportunity to experience God's presence and power. In the midst of the storms of our lives, individually and collectively, whether that is unemployment, hunger, difficult finances, illness, threat of contracting COVID, tensions in family relationships, or civil unrest, as we wonder how we will cope, Jesus invites us: "come to me."

Jesus does not force himself upon us. He just nudges us, and says, "Here I am if you want me." He may disappear into the sea-mist again for a time, and we may sink into the water like mistrustful Peter. But it all ends with a welcome and a recognition that Jesus can handle even a life-threatening situation.

In the scriptures and spiritual writings, the Christian community is often depicted as a boat, with Peter at the helm. Our faith and trust in the Lord's guidance are sustained by that boat of community. In our current unsettled waters of life, we may be tempted to just go it alone, to seek solace in personal prayer and devotion. This is intensified by the more limited opportunities we have for gathered Sunday worship. However, we need reminders that parish, small

groups, family and other forms of Christian community are necessary to our spiritual well-being. They offer strength and support as we hold one another in prayer and reach out in service.

The prophet Elijah reminds us in today's first reading to *"Go outside and stand on the mountain before the Lord; the Lord will be passing by."* Elijah discovers God's presence not in the wind, or earthquake or fire – but in a tiny, whispering sound.

God finds ways to speak peace to us. I encourage you this week to take some time in God's creation – even your own backyard – to listen for and know God's love surrounding you and holding the whole world in the palms of his hands.


