God at Work: The Vocation of Reed Sandblast

I grew up attending Mass at Our Lady of the Lake. My parents still live in the neighborhood and are active parishioners at OLL. Even at a young age I've had a passion for Spanish and Latin American culture. This passion was ignited at the age of 12 when my family hosted an exchange student, Diego, from Ecuador. He became like an older brother to me.

When I was in eighth grade, I remember feeling called to the priesthood for the first time. I spent a whole week asking God to provide direction for what He desired for my life. At the end of that week, Father John Kerns came up to me after Sunday Mass and, without me mentioning anything to him, he told me that I should become a priest. This was the start of my call; however, it was not until much later that I acted on it.

After graduating from Lake Oswego High School, and before starting college, I went to visit Diego and his family in Ecuador, to work on his family's farm. I became fluent in Spanish, and it was through this experience that I gained the skillset, not only in Spanish, but in connecting with people of different cultures and backgrounds. I can clearly see how Christ used that experience to reignite my



faith and prepare me for the priesthood.

The summer of my Junior year at Oregon State University, I had an internship with the FBI and was preparing for a career serving my country. I drifted away from the church, and at points, away from God. I felt very successful. I had a direction and a goal. I felt I did not need Him because

I was achieving so much on my own. I always knew that God was calling me to the priesthood, yet I was afraid of boldly answering this call because I knew it would mean giving up my desire for a family, career, and other worldly pleasures. So, I buried this feeling deep inside me throughout high school and college.

In June 2020 I graduated from OSU with a Bachelor of Arts in Spanish and a Bachelor of Science in Political Science – International Affairs. And now, instead of seeking a career in service to my country, I am preparing for my novitiate with the Saint John Society. What changed? It seems that even when my focus on Christ dimmed, His focus on me remained ever strong.

To those who have drifted away from the Church, my message of hope is quite simple. I have been there. Ultimately, I realized that there was something lacking that external success could not fulfill. There was a feeling of emptiness, that even with all the pleasures I enjoyed, would not leave me.



Through a process of searching, I came to the realization that Jesus Christ is alive. Today. Nothing else matters in this world. Christ created us for something more. He let us be born right now, in this day and age, desiring our salvation. There is nothing we can possibly do to lose that love and there is nothing He desires more than to be our friend. Nothing will ever fulfill us except for a personal relationship with Christ. I know it seems a lofty goal, you have no idea where to start, and no desire to lose those things that you hold dear right now. Yet, if you dare to crack the door open just a little, to allow God a little opening, there is nothing He can't do. Nothing He can't change. There is no greater love you will ever feel, and I am a personal testimony to this love.

One of my favorite quotes ever from CS Lewis is the following, “*Christianity, if false, is of no importance, and if true, of infinite importance. The only thing it cannot be is moderately important.*” I had been living my whole life as if Jesus was moderately important. Christianity was just another part of my life; church was something that I went to but never who I was. When I reconverted to my faith, I recognized that if Jesus is who he says he is, then there is nothing else that I could possibly desire except Him. Christ only needs us to search for Him, to be open to His truth and light, and there is no darkness that His light won’t touch in our lives.



ONLINE GIVING IN 3 EASY STEPS

If you are already using online giving skip step 1 and 2. (If you forgot your user ID or password click the forgot button and a new password will be emailed to you.)

STEP 1 - REGISTER

- From www.ollparish.com
- Click "Giving" in top right navigation bar
- Click on "Give Now"
- Click on **CREATE A NEW ACCOUNT**.
- Fill in the information boxes that contain a red asterisk. Make sure to write down your User ID and Password.
- **Submit.** You will receive an email to confirm your information.

STEP 2 – SET UP METHOD

- Now log into your account, click on **MY PAYMENT METHOD**.
- You will need to **ADD NEW BANK ACCOUNT** (if using your checking account) OR **ADD NEW CREDIT CARD** (if using your credit card).
- Provide all the information requested. Then click **SUBMIT**.

STEP 3 – SET UP DONATION

- OPTIONS:** You can choose multiple funds (RE, Maintenance, SVdP)
- Return to **MANAGE MY ACCOUNT** and choose **GIVE A NEW GIFT**.
 - Choose **OFFERTORY** (fund), then select gift type **RECURRING**.
 - Select payment and frequency and start date.
 - Select the account (check or credit card), then enter amount and frequency.
 - Click **NEXT** (bottom of page)
 - In the **CONFIRM MY GIFTS** window, review the details to insure everything is correct.
- Click **SUBMIT**.

Sack Lunch Meals of Mercy

The need throughout the Portland Metro has increased, both with food insecure families and the unsheltered. Mercy Teams will continue our Sack Lunch Meals of Mercy Outreach through the month of July.

To date parishioners have donated and delivered 20,000 sack lunch meals of mercy, and another 135 family meals, each serving 5 to 6 individuals. All of this since the end of March.
