Livestream Mass Project Update

Good news! This week our remote video recording system project in the church was completed and we are now able to livestream daily and weekend Masses as well as special events including funerals and our First Friday Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. The project was funded by a generous donation from one of our parishioners. We are grateful for this gift that extends our ability to gather in the challenging times, but which will also connect our parish community in the future especially the elderly and parishioners unable to physically attend Mass.

We began video recording and uploading Saturday evening vigil Mass when the COVID-19 quarantine started back in March. Originally, we were using three physical cameras wired to a computer in the center aisle of the church. The weekly set up and cable lines prevented all but the crew from attending Mass. Over the summer,

three remote cameras and monitoring equipment were installed and now we have full capacity to automatically livestream any Mass or prayer service.

How to Watch Livestream Mass

To watch Livestream Mass, go to our parish website homepage www.ollparish.com and click on the white button that says "Watch Livestream Mass" or click on the picture in the rotating slider button below. Both will bring

you to our **Streamspot frame** (see image). When you click on the arrow you can:

- Watch Mass directly if we are live broadcasting
- Search archives of recorded Masses, funerals, and events
- See the upcoming broadcast schedule

On that page you can also connect to our parish YouTube or Facebook pages if you are more accustomed to watching in

those feeds. Right below you will find our weekly Gospel reflection video and audio recordings of the Sunday homilies. If you watch through the StreamSpot, you can also "cast" the video to a living room TV or other device if you are familiar with that technology. All these tasks are also available from a smartphone or tablet.



We are still refining our

settings and learning some of the ways and means of the system, but we are grateful to have this new capacity to engage our parish on a daily basis. We are preparing a plan to offer Sunday morning Mass attendance in the parish hall since all weekend Masses will also be able to be livestreamed. Stay tuned for more details in our announcements and weekly email.

Sunday Rosary for Peace in Our Election



Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament

"The visit to the Blessed Sacrament is a great treasure of the Catholic faith. It nourishes social love and gives us opportunities for adoration and thanksgiving, for reparation and supplication. Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, and Holy Hours are likewise a precious element of your heritage--in full accord with the teaching of the Second Vatican Council."

On Friday, November 6, 2020 and on each First Friday of the month, we will now offer an extended time of Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament in the Church, concluding with a Holy Hour of devotional prayer and Benediction. The normal times for this extended period is from after the morning Mass, approximately 9:30 Am, throughout the day, with Holy Hour beginning at 7:00 PM and concluding with Benediction.

Eucharistic Adoration, Exposition, and the Real Presence

Catholics believe that Jesus Christ – Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity – is truly present in the Holy Eucharist. This central tenet of our faith inspires us to devotion and prayer. It is the reason that Our Lady of the Lake church open during daytime hours, so that the faithful may "stop and linger" before the Blessed Sacrament on the main altar, a prayer practice that goes back to the earliest days of the Church. The red candle burning in the sanctuary lamp is a sign of Christ's abiding presence and the reason we make devotional gestures such as a genuflection or bow when entering the church.

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament takes place when the Eucharist (consecrated host) is "exposed" in a monstrance and placed on the altar for adoration. Since the Second Vatican Council, the Catholic church has made Eucharistic exposition and benediction a liturgical service in its own right in order to draw attention to its primary meaning from the Eucharistic celebration at Mass. Exposition provides a more visible opportunity for *spiritual communion* in times when we may not be able to physically receive the Eucharist at Mass and a chance to further meditate on this great gift of Christ's presence, particularly in these times of restricted attendance.

Participate in Person or through Livestream

ALL parishioners are invited to attend in person at any time – simply come to the main church entrance. You can also participate through livestream from our parish website. ACTS Retreat participants are present throughout the day and serve as door monitors and ushers. We hope you will join us.




STEP 3 – SET UP DONATION
