Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Behold the Lamb of God

John was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he said, "Behold, the Lamb of God." The two disciples heard what he said and followed Jesus. Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, "What are you looking for?"


They said to him, "Rabbi"—which translated means Teacher—, "where are you staying?" He said to them, "Come, and you will see." ~ John 1:35-39 ~

This passage from the beginning of the Gospel of John describes the call of the first disciples and takes place in the Jordan valley, where John was baptizing. The first two to be called are disciples of John, so had joined his group of those waiting for the Messiah. They were ready when John pointed him out. Andrew, brother of Simon Peter, was one of the two, and immediately goes to tell his brother the Good News.

It is noteworthy that Jesus first calls them to be with him – *Come, and you will see* – and they remain with him for a time. First in our call to follow Christ comes prayer and getting to know Christ, before we can actively work for Christ and bring others to share his joy. Only after spending time with Jesus the Teacher are we prepared to bring others to keep company with the Lord.

Come, and You Will See

As we begin the liturgical season of Ordinary Time in this new year, we have a great opportunity to reset our daily practices of prayer and spiritual reading so that we can rest in Jesus' company and learn from him. This is what disciples do – spend time with The Teacher. Young or old, children or senior adults, if we are to follow Christ, we need



to make time to study his words and the example of his life. *How will you do that more regularly this year?*

Attending Mass and the sacraments is a good place to start. We have recently added capacity at weekend Masses and there is always room at the daily Masses. Setting a time each day for spiritual reading is easier than ever through digital app resources. Consider Fr. Mike Schmitz' *The Bible in a Year* podcast from Ascension Press, or Bishop Robert Barron's *Word on Fire* daily scripture reflections – two simple yet great ways to let your phone inspire you to take time away from social media.

I encourage you to check out the Faith Formation links on our parish website for additional age-appropriate resources provided for children, parents, youth and adults (ollparish.com/faith-formation). Liturgy, Music, and Prayer

Here Am I, Lord

This Sunday we begin the winter season of Ordinary Time, this year marking six weeks between Christmas and Lent. Liturgically, we hear the Gospel of Mark in this cycle of readings, which focus on the beginning of Jesus' mission and this Sunday, the call of the disciples in John's Gospel. What is our response? Psalm 40 provides an opportunity to reflect.

Respect Life

Each year on January 22, all dioceses in the United States are called to observe a **Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children**. January 22 is the 48th anniversary of the Supreme Court decisions that legalized abortion throughout our nation. Since then, over 60 million lives have been lost.

On Friday, we set aside a day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life. It is also a day of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion. We are each called to observe this day through the penitential practices of prayer, fasting and/or giving alms.

All faithful in the Archdiocese are asked to join in prayer for **9 Days for Life**, a novena for the intention that all human life be respected. Each of the nine days highlights a related topic and includes an intercession, prayers, a reflection, and one step further you might take.

Join a rosary and reflection from Archdiocese of Portland clergy and lay leaders, LIVE each evening from January 21-29 at 7:00pm. Go to evangelization.archdpdx.org/9-days-for-life.
