Jesus the Healer

"When it was evening, after sunset, they brought to him all who were ill or possessed by demons. The whole town was gathered at the door. He cured many who were sick with various diseases, and he drove out many demons, not permitting them to speak because they knew him." – Mark 1:32-34



In this week's Gospel, we are introduced to Jesus' other primary mission – to heal and cure diseases of body and mind. Jesus the Healer draws many in the crowd and they follow him. In that moment they listen to his teaching with authority, as we heard in last week's Gospel passage. When we come to the Lord for refuge in our hour of need, our hearts and minds are often more open to hearing his Word and following his will for our lives. We need the Lord as both our Teacher and Healer.

This has been a most difficult year, especially for those in our community who are homebound or less able to travel due to the risks of the COVID-19 virus. Many parishioners have been isolated in their homes or residences - even from family and friends – which has taken an emotional toll on their well-being. Sadly, for most of the last year, the pandemic restrictions have prevented our Hospital and Pastoral ministers from bringing Holy Communion to nursing homes, and the homebound.

Recently, the Archdiocese has updated instructions to allow family members to bring Holy Communion to their homebound loved ones. This assumes the individual family member is regularly in contact and does not pose an outside threat of transmitting the virus to the recipient. The policy does not apply to anyone who is physically able to attend Mass at the parish, only to those who are physically homebound due to the virus or another medical condition. (See instructions below.)

Jesus, in the Most Holy Eucharist, is our compassionate Healer. We come to the Lord in our need. May we know the height and depth, length and breadth of God's love for us, and may we be sustained for the journey as disciples.

Holy Communion for the Home Bound

For the benefit of the Home Bound who are at risk of COVID infection, and who are unable to participate in the Eucharistic Celebration in person, to receive Holy Communion on a regular basis, a spouse or any Catholic adult family member may be trained to bring you the Eucharist. Call for Ministers / Receiving Holy Communion

It has been nearly a year since we had to make changes and restrictions to attending Mass and receiving Holy Communion in response to the increased risks associated with the COVID-19. Our parish staff is grateful for the many ways you have responded and followed procedures as our practices have evolved and changed.

We are also grateful for the liturgical ministers who have continued to serve as lectors, sacristans, ushers, door monitors, and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion in these challenging times. Thank you for your dedication and commitment to assisting in the celebration of Mass on weekdays and weekends.

Here is an open call to other members of the parish to consider serving in one of these ongoing ministries. As we prepare for Lent and Easter, we are in need of others to regularly serve. We are happy to provide training. Contact Agnes Zueger for more information at agnesz@ollparish.com.

Receiving Holy Communion

Last weekend, Fr. John reminded the congregation of the "best practices" of receiving Holy Communion on the hand or the tongue. These are especially critical to observe well as we continue to take precautions for the virus. Here's a reminder.

When receiving Holy Communion on the hand: please place your receiving hand out flat with the hand you will pick up the host underneath in support. Try not to curl your fingers. This allows the Communion minister to place the Holy Eucharist securely without touching your hand directly.

When receiving Holy Communion on the tongue: please open your mouth fully and extend your tongue over your lower lip. This allows the Communion minister to place the Eucharist securely without touching your tongue directly. Also, try not to suddenly lean forward. Simply stand erect with your tongue extended.

We have also posted a very helpful short video on our parish website (www.ollparish.com/sacraments) that illustrates these practices. Thanks for your understanding and cooperation.

INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY AT OUR LADY OF THE LAKE

Policy adjusted for COVID-19 pandemic.

Weekdays: Parish programs follow the morning snow closure and bad weather directions of the Lake Oswego School District. When the Lake Oswego schools are closed, parish programs are also closed.

Weekends or evenings: If there is a sudden change in the weather during the day, or the program meets in the evening or on a weekend, the Program Director or group organizer of the respective programs will make the decision as to the closure based upon consideration of the different areas surrounding OLL. National Day of Prayer for Victims Survivors of Human Trafficking (February 8)

The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) Committee on Migration designated February 8 as an annual day of prayer for survivors and victims of human trafficking. February 8 is the feast day of St. Josephine Bakhita, who was kidnapped as a child and sold into slavery in Sudan and Italy. Once Josephine was freed, she dedicated her life to sharing her testament of deliverance from slavery and comforting the poor and suffering.

According to law enforcement, some signs to look for include people who work and live in the same place, who owe a debt to their employers, or whose employers have control over their immigration documents. Trafficked people could have signs of trauma, fatigue, injuries, or could be withdrawn or show signs of censored communication (*Catholic Sentinel July 5-8, 2013*).

Black History Month at Our Lady of the Lake School

The Catholic Church's Social Justice Teaching articulates the wisdom of building a just society and lays the foundation for living a life worth living. Year round, Catholic Social Teachings, such as "Life and Dignity of the Human Person", "Solidarity," and "Rights and Responsibilities," are reinforced and taught by teachers. These values teach students that we are one human family, and that a healthy community can be achieved only if human rights are protected and responsibilities are met.

During the month of February, Black History Month, teachers at OLL traditionally set time aside to provide opportunities for students to recognize contributions made to American life by black citizens.
