Zeal for My Father's House

Jesus made a whip out of cords and drove them all out of the temple area, with the sheep and oxen, and spilled the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables, and to those who sold doves he said, "Take these out of here, and stop making my Father's house a marketplace." His disciples recalled the words of Scripture, "Zeal for your house will consume me."

~ John 2:15-17 ~

In this Sunday's Gospel Jesus turns things in the temple upside down - literally. In a scene very uncharacteristic for our image of Jesus as Compassionate Healer, we are confronted with trying to understand the reason for his righteous anger and actions. It is likely one of the final reasons Temple authorities wanted to eliminate Jesus and ultimately, seek to put him to death.

So, on this Third Sunday of Lent, as we mark one full year of living in a world turned upside down by the Covid-19 virus and economic pandemic, not to mention significant storms and political unrest, we might ask ourselves, *"Have the world-wide deaths, suffering, isolation, and awareness of the fragility of life in the past year moved us closer toward a right relationship with God and our neighbors?"*

Ten Commandments, Two Missions

For perspective, today's first reading from the Book of Exodus provides us with the account of God giving Moses

the Ten Commandments. Jesus will ultimately summarize the ten into the two core life principles: *Love God and Love Your Neighbor* – which we have chosen as essential to our OLL parish mission.

Love God: Do I have the same zeal, the same passion and purpose to put God first in my life, above all things – yes, even work, family, and personal goals? How do I honor God's name and give God time in prayer and sabbath? What time-consuming activity would Jesus upturn and challenge me to root out or right-size in my life?

Love My Neighbor: Does the suffering of others in my community and in the world move me to personal action, and generosity of time and treasure in response? How do I honor and respect the God-given dignity of my parents, family members, persons of other races, cultures, countries, or political viewpoints? What do I "covet" that prevents me from honoring life in all ages, stages and the environment of God's creation? What attitude or complacency would Jesus upturn in my life?

Our Lenten journey provides us the opportunity through more intentional prayer, fasting from foods and activities, and greater attention to almsgiving to "turn our hearts" as Jesus would invite us have the same "zeal" for Our Father in Heaven.

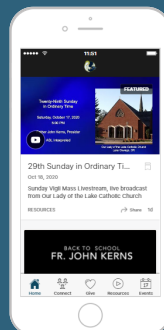

ONLINE GIVING IN 3 EASY STEPS

If you are already using online giving skip step 1 and 2. (if you forgot your user ID or password click the forgot button and a new password will be emailed to you)

STEP 1 - REGISTER

- From OLL website www.ollparish.com
- Click **"Giving"** in top right navigation bar
- Click on **"Give Now"**
- Click on **CREATE A NEW ACCOUNT**.
- Fill in the information boxes that contain a red asterisk. Make sure to write down your User ID and Password (put in a secure and safe place.)
- **Submit.** You will receive an email to confirm your information.



STEP 2 - SET UP PAYMENT METHOD

- Now log into your account, click on **MY PAYMENT METHOD**.
- You will need to **ADD NEW BANK ACCOUNT** (if using your checking account) OR **ADD NEW CREDIT CARD** (if using your credit card).
- Provide all the information requested. Then click **SUBMIT**.

STEP 3 - SET UP DONATION

OPTIONS: You can choose multiple funds (RE, Building Maintenance, SVdP)

- Now return to **MANAGE MY ACCOUNT** and choose **GIVE A NEW GIFT**.
- Choose **OFFERTORY** (fund), then select gift type **RECURRING**.
- Select payment and frequency and start date.
- Select the account (check or credit card), then enter amount and frequency.
- Click **NEXT** (at the bottom of the page)
- In the **CONFIRM MY GIFTS** window, review the details to insure all is correct. Click **SUBMIT**.

Call for Liturgical Ministers

It has been one year since we had to make changes and restrictions to attending Mass and receiving Holy Communion in response to the increased risks associated with the COVID-19. Our parish staff is grateful for the many ways you have responded and followed procedures as our practices have evolved and changed.

We are also grateful for the liturgical ministers who have continued to serve as lectors, sacristans, ushers, door monitors, and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion in these challenging times. Thank you for your dedication and commitment to assisting in the celebration of Mass on weekdays and weekends.

Receiving Holy Communion

As we continue in these pandemic times, Fr. John has reminded us of the “best practices” of receiving Holy Communion on the hand or the tongue. These are especially critical to observe well as we continue to take precautions for the virus.

When receiving Holy Communion on the hand: please place your receiving hand out flat with the hand you will pick up the host underneath in support. Try not to curl your fingers. This allows the Communion minister to place the Holy Eucharist securely without touching your hand directly.

When receiving Holy Communion on the tongue: please open your mouth fully and extend your tongue over your lower lip. This allows the Communion minister to place the Eucharist securely without touching your tongue directly. Also, try not to suddenly lean forward. Simply stand erect with your tongue extended.

INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY AT OUR LADY OF THE LAKE

Policy adjusted for COVID-19 pandemic.

Weekdays: Parish programs follow the morning snow closure and bad weather directions of the Lake Oswego School District. When the Lake Oswego schools are closed, parish programs are also closed.

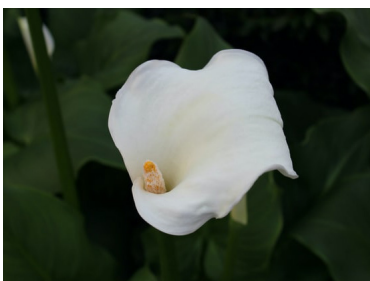

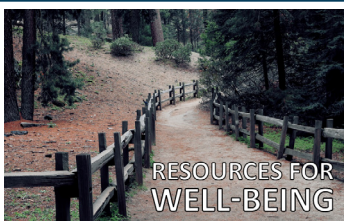
