

# Palms, Passion, and Purpose



Our Lenten journey – to the desert follow me – has led us, finally, to Jesus' triumphant entry to Jerusalem. We wave our palm branches and sing, All Glory, Laud, and Honor, as we begin the Mass, but soon are confronted with the full story again proclaimed, of Jesus' passion and death by crucifixion. His humble obedience to the Father's will is a confrontation of the status quo, and the Jewish and Roman authorities reject his message forgiveness and love. The cross of Christ becomes the ultimate sign of God's love for us, redemptive suffering, our salvation.

As we prepare for this Holy Week and the liturgies of the Supper of the Lord on Holy Thursday, the Passion of the Lord on Good Friday,

and the Solemn Vigil in the Holy Night of Holy Saturday, we live out the story again – to remember – but also to celebrate the continuing fulfillment of God's promise of eternal life. Do we believe?

My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?

Perhaps no line in today's scriptures will resonate more strongly with us today than the antiphon from Psalm 22: My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?

How many times in this challenging year of pandemic, severe storms, tragic fires and social unrest have we each wondered if we have been abandoned? Who in your circle of family and friends may still need an encouraging word from you? Though some signs of life are emerging with the availability of vaccinations, return to schools, and partial opening of businesses, there are still many challenges ahead and we need the eyes of faith to see and endure.

The Lord God is my help, therefore I am not disgraced; I have set my face like flint, knowing that I shall not be put to shame. ~Isaiah 50:7

May the words of the prophet Isaiah that we hear in today's first reading, which describe the attitude of the Suffering Servant, also be on our lips — be our purpose — as we walk with the Lord in this Holy Week. May we know the height and depth, the length and breadth of God's love for us, as we approach the celebration of Easter joy.

"Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!"

# Liturgy, Music, and Prayer

### **Consecration to St. Joseph**

Pope Francis, recalling the 150th anniversary of the declaration of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church, has proclaimed a "Year of St. Joseph" from December 8, 2020 to December 8, 2021. Last week, Fr. Suresh encouraged us to organize special prayers and devotions, dedicated to the foster father of Jesus, to mark the "Year of St. Joseph." Parishioners who are interested are invited to consecrate themselves to St. Joseph.

#### What does it mean to consecrate yourself to St. Joseph?

Basically, consecration means to entrust yourself entirely to his paternal care so that he can help you acquire his virtues and become holy. The person who consecrates himself to St. Joseph wants to be as close as possible to his spiritual father. St. Joseph, in turn, will give those consecrated to him his undivided attention, protection and guidance.

#### How Is consecration to St. Joseph done and what is the method?

Consecration to St. Joseph is a comprehensive program of preparation and consecration to St. Joseph for individuals, families, parishes, and dioceses. It is a 33-day preparation and consecration. On each day of the 33-day preparation (Day 1 and Day 2 are the only exception), a short exposition on one of the invocations in the Litany of St. Joseph is presented (in Part I), followed by a reading on St. Joseph (a section of Part II), concluding with the recitation of the Litany of St. Joseph (found in Part III). The 33-day preparation requires about 20 to 30 minutes a day. If you miss a day, just make it up and continue your preparation.

It is recommended to choose a day to begin preparation that will coincide with a liturgical feast of St. Joseph. The 33-day program begins in OLL Parish on March 30 and ends on May 1, the Feast of St. Joseph the Worker. It can be undertaken on your own or in a group.


