




People: For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours now and for ever. 10

Act of Spiritual Communion

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive you sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.

For Catholics, the Holy Eucharist is our highest form of worship, a public statement in our belief, that what was previously bread and wine has now become, through this act of worship, the true existence of the body and blood of Jesus Christ. This is why it is distributed only to Catholics who believe the nature of this Sacrament.

Non-Catholics are invited to come forward for a blessing during Communion. Please place your right arm across your heart to indicate to the Eucharistic Minister your desire for a blessing. Or, if you prefer, you may be seated at this time.




