The Liturgies of the Sacred Paschal TRIDUUM

Triduum

The Sacred Paschal Triduum of the passion and resurrection of the Lord is the summit of the liturgical year.

These are the liturgies of Thursday of the Lord's Supper at the Evening Mass, Friday of the Passion of the Lord, the Easter Vigil in the Holy Night, and Easter Sunday of The Resurrection of the Lord. The procession that closes the Holy Thursday Mass moves into the simple beginning of Good Friday. Welcoming the newly baptized in the Easter Vigil prepares us for the joys of the Sunday of the Resurrection.

We celebrate the Paschal Mystery (Jesus' death and resurrection) in our lives and in the life of the Church. Our worship through liturgical signs and sacraments unites us to Christ in intimate communion. We remember our conversion of heart, the Holy Spirit present in our lives, and our mission as Christians.

Easter Vigil

THE EASTER VIGIL IN THE HOLY NIGHT

On this night when the Lord rose from the dead, the Church keeps watch.

First we light the Easter fire and follow the Paschal Candle as the Israelites followed the pillar of fire by night. Then we hear the Easter proclamation, the poetic text of the whole Easter story.

In the readings we hear the story of God bringing salvation to all people. Then we sing the first Alleluia since Lent began. The Paschal Mystery of the death and resurrection of the Lord is proclaimed in this first Easter Mass.

Those to be baptized (the Elect) have completed the final preparations of Lent. Tonight we baptize them. We repeat our baptismal promises. We remember our baptism in the sprinkling of blessed water. The candidates for reception into full communion, and the newly baptized (neophytes), are confirmed in their faith.

For the first time these new Catholics (neophytes) join us in communion at the table of the Risen Lord in the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

Act of Spiritual Communion

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and desire to receive You into my soul. For Catholics, the Holy Eucharist is our highest form of worship; a public statement in our belief, that what was previously bread and wine has now become, through this act of worship, the true existence of the body and blood of Jesus Christ. This is why it is distributed only to Catholics who believe the nature of this Sacrament.

Non-Catholics are invited to come forward for a blessing during Communion. Please place your right arm across your heart to indicate to the Eucharistic Minister your desire for a blessing. Or, if you prefer, you may be seated at this time.




