The Resurrection of the Body

Look at my hands and my feet, that it is I myself. Touch me and see, because a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you can see I have." And as he said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. While they were still incredulous for joy and were amazed, he asked them, "Have you anything here to eat?" They gave him a piece of baked fish; he took it and ate it in front of them.



~ Luke 24:39-40 ~

One of the most memorable stories after Jesus' Resurrection is how he meets the two disciples on their way to Emmaus, interprets the scriptures for them, and shares a meal. The disciples never make it to Emmaus! Their experience of the Risen Christ in the Eucharistic meal is so amazing and transforming that they immediately head back to Jerusalem to tell the other disciples.

Now Jesus meets the whole group of disciples in their refuge, the Upper Room. Once again, their meeting is with a real person, not a disembodied ghost or phantom appearance. That is why Jesus asks for and eats a piece of fish.

At every Mass, Jesus reveals himself in the fullness of his Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity, and the Eucharist is always an occasion for us to get to know the Risen Christ better. Moreover, the important lesson of these accounts of Jesus' Resurrection is that through our Baptism into Christ, we share in the promise of Eternal Life – the Resurrection of our bodies, our whole person, not just our souls. How will this be true? That is the essence of our faith and what we declare each Sunday as we recite the Nicene or Apostle's Creed.

You Are Witnesses of These Things

This pandemic year has provided us with plenty of bad news, a sense of loss and disheartening stories that send us on our way to "Emmaus." In the midst of our broken lives, Jesus meets us, the Resurrected Christ, and declares that this moment is not the end of the story. He IS the Good News and invites us to tell others of our trust in the promise of resurrection. We must be witnesses of "these things."

"What things?" Jesus asked the disciples going to Emmaus. They begin by telling all their fears following his passion and death. One of the simple ways we can act as disciples though, is to tell the stories of grace and blessing that we have received. Where have you seen the Risen Christ in the simplest of places in the past months? For me, the miracle of COVID vaccinations has allowed so many more people to return to Mass for the first time in over a year. Celebrating and sharing in the Eucharist with them has been a personal grace and blessing. Truly Good News!

 - 3 Then they knew it was Jesus and they hastened in to shore; bread and fish for their breakfast from the hands of their Lord."O Peter, if you love me you must care for my sheep; if you follow your Shepherd, then a shepherd you'll be."
 - 4 When the road makes us weary, when our labor seems but loss, when the fire of faith weakens and too high seems the cost, let the Church turn to its risen Lord, who for us bore the cross, and we'll find our hearts burning at the sound of his voice.


