Following the Good Shepherd


Jesus said: "I am the good shepherd, and I know mine and mine know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I will lay down my life for the sheep. I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. These also I must lead, and they will hear my voice, and there will be one flock, one shepherd."

~ John 10:14-16 ~

Do you know the Good Shepherd? How do you listen for the promptings of Jesus' voice and follow his direction in your life? These are perhaps the most basic spiritual questions we might ask of ourselves and strive to answer on a continuing basis.

Each year during the Easter season, we hear passages from St. John's Gospel account on this "Good Shepherd Sunday." We prayerfully reflect on that engaging image as we sing the beloved and most remembered Psalm 23, "*The Lord is my shepherd, there is nothing I shall want.*" And in the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles we hear proclaimed, "*There is no salvation through anyone else, nor is there any other name under heaven given to the human race by which we are to be saved.*"

The protection and care of the Good Shepherd has taken on new meaning



this past year as the entire planet continues to confront pandemic. Do we turn to Christ for a sense of true direction for our lives amidst the competing voices that permeate our world? In the chaos of the daily news cycle, how do we focus on the voice from the One who knows us most intimately, lovingly? Following the Good Shepherd's requires *listening for the Good Shepherd's voice*. We do that in prayer but too often our prayer time can be overly filled with our own words, recitation and petitions for what we need. This doesn't mean we should abandon our basic prayers, or traditional devotions. But a simple truth is that we can't listen when we are talking. Silence allows us to *hear* the voice of the Good Shepherd, to ponder the stirrings in our heart, and to reflect on the urgings of the Holy Spirit.

How can we take more time for silence as prayer, and within our daily prayer? Creating a special prayer space in the home, with Bible, cross and candles, icons of saints, or photos of loved ones, can help to focus our attention. Setting aside a designated time each day for prayer can also give us the mental "space" for silence.

Consider this: sometimes the voice of the Good Shepherd may come to us through the loving expressions of friends and family reassuring us, comforting us, challenging us, and praying with us. May we listen with open hearts and minds.


