You Will Be My Witnesses

You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.

~ Acts 1:8 ~

To *give* witness, to be a witness requires a bold spirit and a sense of responsibility and purpose. Whether in a court of law or in a spirited conversation with friends or foreigners, when we are asked for what we know or have seen to be true, we need to speak from the heart with conviction. It takes courage to be a witness.

This weekend we celebrate the Ascension of the Lord into Heaven and hear St. Luke's account of how the first apostles witnessed Jesus' being taken up from their sight. I love the next line: "Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky?" Basically, "The Men in White" call out the disciples for standing around when they just heard Jesus tell them to go to the "ends of the earth" to tell the Good News. Of course, we know the Holy Spirit did inspire them on Pentecost to go forth, and we are beneficiaries of their bold sacrifice through the ages to pass on the faith.

Tell the Stories of Grace and Blessing

One of the five essential tasks of Christian disciples is to tell the stories of grace and blessing that we have we received from Our Lord. Even in our darkest times – seasons of grief, physical difficulties, or life challenges, there are still glimpses of the light of Christ reaching us in small, yet significant ways. What are the ways God's love has been revealed to you in the recent past? Maybe a friend or family member has done something special for you. Maybe a child or parent called to check in or send greetings. When we take time to recall these simple gifts, we'll be amazed at our



blessings. Don't look at the sky but find ways to tell others of God's graces.

Using Our Gifts for Others

One of the best ways to share God's grace and blessings is to use our God-given talents to help others. Some may say: "Pay it forward." This is the work of the Church and each of our responsibilities as disciples. In today's second reading we hear St. Paul encourage the Ephesians to use their gifts "to build up the body of Christ" (Eph. 4:12), In the next few weeks, we'll be exploring how we can put the Gifts of the Holy Spirit to work in these challenging times in our parish and in the world. After all, they are not "gifts" if we don't find ways to give them away. How has God blessed you, and how are you being called in this moment to bless others?

The Parish Needs Your Input for Our Future

We are on the verge of retiring our \$3.6 million debt! We have less than \$500K yet to pay off and we have pledges from parishioners to cover that over the next 14 months. AND we have the new roof on the church. All of this is due to the generosity of parishioners like you. Back in 2016, when we started this campaign the debt was the main priority, but we raised enough

in pledges for a new roof, too. We also wanted to remodel the hall and make some

adaptations to the church, but that needed to wait. Now we need your input as to how we should proceed so that we can accomplish those "Phase II" projects.

The Facilities and Development Committee is hosting virtual focus groups on May 18 and 19 at 7:00 pm. We are seeking input from parish members as we review our strategic plan and get ready for our post COVID future.

Oregon Health Authority Releases 2020 Death with Dignity Report:

- There was a 25% increase in residents requesting lethal prescriptions for assisted suicide.
- 370 people received lethal prescriptions. Of that group, 245 died from ingesting the lethal medication (up from 188 in 2019).
- Since the law was passed in 1997, doctors have written 2,895 lethal prescriptions. 1,905 people have committed assisted suicide after ingesting the medications.
- Of the 142 physicians who wrote lethal prescriptions in 2020, approximately 112 provided 1 or 2 prescriptions.
- At least one doctor provided lethal prescriptions for 31 people.
- Only 3 patients were referred to psychological counseling.
- 74 percent of patients were covered by Medicare or Medicaid insurance.
- Despite being billed as the reason for the Act in the first place, uncontrollable pain is not listed as one of the top seven reasons assisted suicide is sought

"Oregon's so-called 'Death With Dignity' Act has raised serious concerns, including Oregon's failures to address mental health concerns," said Lois Anderson, ORTL executive director. "Out of 370 Oregonians prescribed with life-ending drugs in 2020, only three were referred for psychological or psychiatric help. Financial concerns are also a part of this decision."
