Old Things Have Passed Away

In this new creation all our standards, hopes and expectations have undergone a transformation. The message of the Gospel makes sense only in the light of the Resurrection. *Old things have passed away and new things have come*



Do You Not Yet Have Faith?

The disciples are terrified of the storm on the sea in this week's Gospel account. They wake up Jesus who is asleep in the boat as waves and wind surround them. Sound familiar? How often in these past months have we wondered – and still wonder – if God has abandoned us? We should hear well Jesus' response to them: *Do you not yet have faith?* What will it take for us to trust in God's master plan – the Creator of the wind and the seas?

Living Forward

Our world will continue to be turbulent, but we can choose a different path for our hearts. We can *live forward* with a conviction that God is with us, surrounds us, and loves us as we reach out to love others in need. That's the key. When we look beyond ourselves in faith, we see the Christ waiting for us to get busy being part of the new creation. What gifts and talents have you been given to make a difference?

ONLINE GIVING IN 3 EASY STEPS

If you are already using online giving skip step 1 and 2. (if you forgot your user ID or password click the forgot button and a new password will be emailed to you

STEP 1 - REGISTER

- From OLL website <u>www.ollparish.com</u>
- Click "Giving" in top right navigation bar
- Click on "Give Online via My Own Giving"
- Click on CREATE A NEW ACCOUNT.
- Fill in the information boxes that contain a red asterisk. Make sure to write down your User ID and Password (put in a secure and safe place.)
- Submit. You will receive an email to confirm your information.

STEP 2 – SET UP PAYMENT METHOD

- Now log into your account, click on MY PAYMENT METHOD.
- You will need to ADD NEW BANK ACCOUNT (if using your checking account)
 OR ADD NEW CREDIT CARD (if using your credit card).
- Provide all the information requested. Then click **SUBMIT**.

STEP 3 – SET UP DONATION

OPTIONS: You can choose multiple funds (RE, Building Maintenance, SVdP)

- Now return to MANAGE MY ACCOUNT and choose GIVE A NEW GIFT.
- Choose **OFFERTORY** (fund), then select gift type **RECURRING**.
- Select payment and frequency and start date.
- Select the account (check or credit card), then enter amount and frequency.
- Click **NEXT** (at the bottom of the page)
- In the CONFIRM MY GIFTS window, review the details to insure all is correct.
 Click SUBMIT.

Summer Schedule, Hospitality and Ministries

Sunday Mass Schedule

Beginning this Sunday, June 20 we are adjusting the time of the later Sunday Mass to begin one half hour earlier at 11:00 AM. We are only changing for the summer months since we currently do not have faith formation in between the morning Masses. Our Mass schedule will readjust in the fall as we hopefully return to gathering for faith formation activities on Sunday mornings.

Weekday Mass Schedule

Beginning this Monday, June 21 we are also adjusting our weekday Mass schedule. We are moving the **Wednesday and Thursday 6:00 PM Masses back to 6:30 AM** which was a more convenient time for people to attend prior to going to work. We will keep one evening Mass time on Tuesdays at 6:00 PM. Mass will also be at 8:30 AM Monday through Saturday. This will likely be our weekday Mass schedule for the foreseeable future.

After Mass Hospitality

Beginning this Sunday, we will offer hospitality after the morning Masses. This week there will be coffee, juice and other individually wrapped refreshments available in the church courtyard and parish hall middle section in case of rain. Come down and reconnect with your fellow parishioners! In future weeks, the front section of the hall and kitchen will become available for hospitality as Mercy Teams moves its operations to the school cafeteria for the summer months.

Ushers

The Holy Spirit is inviting you to serve as an usher – to offer a spirit of hospitality – especially to many parishioners returning to Mass for the first time in over a year. Consider serving once a month or alternating weeks with another person. Consider serving as a couple or as a family – what a great gift of service!

Eucharistic Ministers

As we increase Mass times and more people attend, we are in need of Eucharistic Ministers willing to serve the Body of Christ to members of the Body of Christ. In prayerful discernment, is Christ calling you to this special ministry?

Scheduling and Training

Our online Ministry Scheduler makes it very convenient to accept an assignment or ask for a substitute if your schedule changes. It can also set up particular service times for certain Masses. We offer training for ALL ministries or you can "shadow" a current minister to see if it is a good fit for you.


