The Gift of Serving in St. Vincent de Paul

You may know me best for my visibility and voice as a cantor at Mass and OLL's Choir Director. My wife, Chris, and I have been members of Our Lady of the Lake parish since June 2000 when we moved here from St. Louis with our two daughters, Karen and Kim. I became Catholic through RCIA in 2007 and continue to serve in our music ministry. But today I want to share with you another lessvisible parish participation, which is a special blessing to me, and invite you to consider.

When I retired from IBM a few years ago, I hoped to use my time to help others, but had no clue where to start. Participating in the St Vincent de Paul Society has been a true answer to that prayer, translating my hope into practical, face-to-face service to those in need. Let me share a special story that illustrates that blessing.

Rita's Story

The delight on the faces of Rita and her 18-year-old son was a joy to behold as they helped bring in the bags of groceries Ron and I had brought to them. God's love was truly present. Rita made it clear that our presence and conversation were as welcome

as the food itself; they had felt very isolated. Her gratitude was genuine and almost overwhelming.

Rita's life had been well planned. She had completed her master's degree en route to becoming a history professor. Her husband provided financial security. They had two great kids and a nice home.

Now her credit has been ruined by divorce. She alone is providing for her two teenage boys. She has a huge student loan debt and owes ten thousand dollars in back rent. Her meager day care job disappeared during COVID, and she didn't know where to turn.

The Assistance St. Vincent de **Paul Provides**

Rita's manager referred her to our St. Vincent de Paul outreach three months ago, and through financial rent assistance, food donations, and simple human contact and listening/talking, we have been able to be part of this difficult journey with her. Seeing the change in her over time is a delight. Rita has become more positive in her outlook, feels her options are clearer, and simply feels "lighter." While the

eviction threat is still present, the future now has hopeful pathways, not just confusing, bleak hopelessness.

I feel especially privileged to be able to bring the blessing of our wonderful OLL parishioner's gifts of mercy to people like Rita. That day, Ron and I only wished our parishioners could be peering over our shoulders, participating in the joy and love we received from one of our clients. Rita exemplifies the focus of our work: to keep people housed, and to prevent homelessness at its inception.

ONLINE GIVING IN 3 EASY STEPS

If you are already using online giving skip step 1 and 2. (if you forgot your user ID or password click the forgot button and a new password will be emailed to you

STEP 1 - REGISTER

- From OLL website www.ollparish.com
- Click "Giving" in top right navigation bar
- Click on "Give Online via My Own Giving"
- Click on CREATE A NEW ACCOUNT.
- Fill in the information boxes that contain a red asterisk. Make sure to write down your User ID and Password (put in a secure and safe place.)
- Submit. You will receive an email to confirm your information.

STEP 2 – SET UP PAYMENT METHOD

- Now log into your account, click on MY PAYMENT METHOD.
- You will need to ADD NEW BANK ACCOUNT (if using your checking account) OR ADD NEW CREDIT CARD (if using your credit card).
- Provide all the information requested. Then click **SUBMIT**.

STEP 3 – SET UP DONATION

OPTIONS: You can choose multiple funds (RE, Building Maintenance, SVdP)

- Now return to MANAGE MY ACCOUNT and choose GIVE A NEW GIFT.
- Choose **OFFERTORY** (fund), then select gift type **RECURRING**.
- Select payment and frequency and start date.
- Select the account (check or credit card), then enter amount and frequency.
- Click **NEXT** (at the bottom of the page)
- In the CONFIRM MY GIFTS window, review the details to insure all is correct.
 Click SUBMIT.

Join Us for Mass in Person

The Sunday 7:30 AM Mass returns each week. We hope the addition of this Mass time will make it easier for more options to attend, and especially families with children at the later Sunday Masses. **Note**: We have adjusted the time of the later Sunday Mass to begin one half hour earlier at 11:00 AM.

Obligation to Attend Mass Restored

Effective July 16, 2021, Archbishop Sample has rescinded the general dispensation from the obligation to participate at Holy Mass on Sundays and holydays of obligation, which he granted on April 6, 2020. This means that the faithful are once again obligated to participate in the Holy Mass on Sundays and on holydays of obligation. The Archbishop emphasized that a serious reason would excuse one from this obligation by virtue of the Church's law itself and as taught in the Catechism of the Catholic Church (n. 2181).

Helping with After Mass Hospitality

Hospitality after the morning Masses is back. Come down and reconnect with your fellow parishioners! Mercy Teams has moved its operations to the school cafeteria for the summer months and we now have use of the front section and kitchen.



We are created to depend upon one another and walk together in suffering. But when loved ones approach life's end, we may not know how to provide compassionate care. Surround your friend or family member with love, support, and companionship that are "anchored in unconditional respect for their human dignity, beginning with respect for the inherent value of their lives" (To Live Each Day with Dignity, USCCB).

- 1. Invite God in.
- 2. Listen.
- 3. Inform yourself.
- 4. Be steadfast in compassion.
- 5. Help them achieve closure.
- 6. Provide opportunities for resolution.
- 7. Reminisce.
- 8. Provide a peaceful atmosphere.
- 9. Show tenderness.
- 10. Bear their transition patiently.

Cardinal Gerald Lacroix of Quebec has suggested that individuals should speak with people who are nearing the end of their lives..."tell that person that he or she has a great worth in your eyes and will always be able to count on your presence," the Canadian primate suggested. He said that the results of these conversations would shed light on the question of assisted suicide, because when people facing terminal illness feel that they are loved, they rarely wish to end their own lives. The demands for assisted suicide, the cardinal said, "disappear when someone is well accompanied" (catholicculture.org).
