The Bread of Life – Real Presence

Amen, amen, I say to you, it was not Moses who gave the bread from heaven; my Father gives you the true bread from heaven. For the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world." So they said to him, "Sir, give us this bread always." Jesus said to them, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst."

~ John 6:32-35 ~

This weekend we continue to hear Jesus' "Bread of Life" discourse in chapter 6 of St. John's Gospel. Our Lord is teaching the gathered crowd as he reveals his divine nature, in contrast to Moses, but also how he will maintain his presence with disciples after his death and resurrection. He says directly: "I am the Bread of Life."

Manna and More

The journey of the people of Israel through the desert of Sinai can be viewed from two quite different perspectives. From one angle it is the time of perfect harmony between God and his people, the honeymoon period when Israel was faithful to the Lord. But it is also the beginning of their murmuring against the Lord, which grow into infidelities and impatience. God miraculously feeds the people with manna in the desert, the "bread of heaven," but they grumble and grow weary. How often do we also become impatient when our prayers seem to go unanswered, even though we have been blessed by God in many other ways?

The Real Presence

In this Gospel scene the people also are seeking a sign to believe that Jesus truly is the One sent by God. Jesus tells them – and us – clearly: *I am the Bread of Life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst*. More than food for the spiritual journey, Jesus reveals his Divine presence *from* all time and *for* all time: God with us, for us, and nourishing us.

Friends, do *we* believe? If we profess that the Eucharist is Christ's true and real presence, the fullness of his Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, how does our belief call us to respond? Sadly, recent surveys expose that many Catholics only consider the Eucharist a "symbol" or sign of God's presence. But

our belief is that the substance or core reality of the bread and wine have been changed into Christ's Body and Blood. By the WORD, the LOGOS from the beginning of time, Christ accomplishes this: *I AM the Bread of life*. We must ponder, and humbly receive.


