The Bread of Life – Spiritual Survival

As Jesus declares this truth of his divinity, the people gathered begin to murmur: "*Is this not Jesus, the son of Joseph? Do we not know his father and mother? How can he say he came*

down from heaven?" They are having a hard time putting aside their lived experience of Jesus in Nazareth to accept Jesus, the Divine Teacher. Then he quotes the prophet Isaiah: *They shall be taught by God.* (Is 54:13)

Sometimes it is difficult for all of us to accept something we know and believe is true – both in life, and certainly when it comes to our relationship with the Lord. It is hard especially with the unbelieving voices in our modern society to put Jesus' human and divine natures together: to know that he lived on earth, was put to death, but also that he was raised and lives as God for all eternity in heaven.

The Real Presence

Perhaps most difficult to accept in Jesus' "Bread of Life" discourse that we have been contemplating these past weeks in the Gospel of St. John is that his "flesh," his Body and Blood, is given "for the life of the world." Many who had

been following Jesus at that time found this teaching hard to believe and left him. How is it for us? Are we willing to enter into a personal relationship with the Lord in prayer that

he might sow in our hearts a deeper understanding of his true and real presence?

Our Spiritual Survival

Just as for Elijah in our first reading, God wants to provide us with food for the spiritual journey. Each of us may face life struggles, personal challenges, or relationship difficulties that seem impossible to overcome. When we add in the current state of the world and weather, all may seem overwhelming.

In the Holy Eucharist, Jesus reveals his Divine presence *from* all time and *for* all time: God with us, for us, and nourishing us. More than food, the Eucharist is given for our spiritual survival. It is

our gateway to eternal life. But we must respond. How are we daily cultivating our relationship with the Lord through prayer, and also by giving witness to Christ's presence in our lives so that others might believe?



Who Should Make Medical Decisions for You If You Cannot?

The safest option is to designate a health care agent who not only understands our Catholic values but also shares them and can apply them to current situations and respond to questions as they arise. This person, usually a close family member or friend, acts as a proxy decision maker if the patient is not able to make his or her own decisions. In choosing an agent or proxy, a person can declare in writing that all treatment and care decisions made on their behalf must be consistent with and not contradict the moral teachings of the Catholic Church.

Some states and healthcare systems have been implementing a troubling document known as a "Physician Order for Life- Sustaining Treatment," also called by a confusing array of acronyms (POLST, MOST, MOLST, or POST). The POLST document is filled out by a doctor or other medical professional to define treatments to be withheld or administered in a future situation. It has been criticized for placing more power in the hands of physicians than in patients' hands. Indeed, in some cases the patient need not even sign the document. Once signed by the physician, it becomes a doctor's order to other medical staff, and may override the patient's own past advance directives and even the patient's appointment of a health care agent.

"Human life is good and to be protected. All medical decisions ought to reflect this core belief. Yet black-and-white answers to our questions about end-of-life issues are not always possible, and it can be very difficult to know how to make medical decisions."
