Humbly welcome the word that has been planted in you and is able to save your souls. Be doers of the word and not hearers only, deluding yourselves. — James 1:22

The Letter of James is one that often gets overlooked in our weekly liturgical focus on the scriptures. The real author is

unknown but believed to be written by James, the first leader of the Jerusalem community after Peter's departure and death. It admonishes the early Christian disciples to not just believe what they have heard (*planted in you*) but to live out the Gospel that Jesus proclaimed while among them.

This passage is paired with our return to the Gospel of Mark after our sojourn through the Bread of Life discourse over the last few weeks. Jesus is again in dialogue with the Pharisees and calling them to task for focusing on ritual laws instead of the conversion of the heart that is truly needed to return to the Lord. We might ask: *Is it law or*

love, our relationship with Christ that motivates our hearts?

Forming Families in the Faith

Recently, all parish households received a letter from our pastor, Fr. John Kerns, describing our new approach to Family Faith Formation that will begin this fall. The mailing included a description of our family-based ministry to elementary schoolaged children, middle school and high school youth, and an overview of our faith formation options for adults of all ages. Key to the changes is our focus on equipping parents and children to learn together and to

put faith into practice in the home and in our community. Fr. John recalled the familiar adage among Christian educators that "*Faith is caught not taught*." We can add as we listen to this week's epistle: *be doers of the Word, not hearers only*.

The mailing included a calendar of events for Fall, Winter and Spring so parents and families can plan ahead for the in-person sessions at the parish. Each area will be fully supported with online resources for sharing at home and individually. Find out more at www.ollparish.com/faith-formation
