October 3, 2021 – Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time GOD PUTS PEOPLE INTO OUR LIFE.

LEARN

Read Bible: Genesis 2:18-24 — Catholic Children's Bible page 24



Then the Lord God said, "It is not good for the man to live alone. I will make a suitable companion to help him." So he took some soil from the ground and formed all the animals and all the birds. Then he brought them to the man to see what he would name them; and that is how they all got their names. So the man named all the birds and all the animals; but not one of them was a suitable companion to help him.

DISCUSS & DO

October 10, 2021 – Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time JESUS WANTS US TO PUT HIM FIRST.



Read Bible: Mark 10:17-27 — Catholic Children's Bible page 1548



As Jesus was starting on his way again, a man ran up, knelt before him, and asked him, "Good Teacher, what must I do to receive eternal life?"

"Why do you call me good?"
Jesus asked him. "No one is good except God alone. You know the commandments: 'Do not commit murder; do not commit adultery; do not steal; do not accuse anyone falsely; do not cheat; respect your father and your mother."

DISCUSS & DO



Explain to your children that God does not want us to keep us from having stuff or doing things we love. He just wants us to put God first above those things we love. Following God should be more important than anything else in our life.

For Preschool-K

ACTIVITY: Talk to your children about what things or people they love and how it is nice to share them with others.

For Grades 1-5

ACTIVITY: Have your children write (or draw) what they love: things, people, activities. Ask how they will be different this week if God is the most important thing in their life. Help them come up with real examples: e.g. spend less time with media so as they can be with a friend, or eat less of a favorite food so they can share it with someone else.

October 17, 2021 – Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time Jesus, Our Great High Priest.

LEARN

Read Bible: Hebrews 4:14-16 — Catholic Children's Bible page 1898



Let us, then, hold firmly to the faith we profess. For we have a great High Priest who has gone into the very presence of God—Jesus, the Son of God. Our High Priest is not one who cannot feel sympathy for our weaknesses. On the contrary, we have a High Priest who was tempted in every way that we are, but did not sin. Let us have confidence, then, and approach God's throne, where there is grace. There we will receive mercy and find grace to help us just when we need it.



Did You Know?



A high priest was the chief priest in the

Jewish religion. He worked in the temple, burned incense, and made offerings to remove people's sins. Jesus was the perfect High Priest. He offered himself up on the cross to remove our sins, so we could be closer to God.

DISCUSS & DO



Explain to your children "God's throne refers to heaven, where there is grace." "Grace" is a gift of love freely given by God that invites us to be with him. How wonderful that God wants us to be with him in heaven and on earth. We show our love to God by praying to him. We can pray in many ways: thinking quietly, saying words loudly, singing, and reading the Bible. We also can pray in many different places: in church, in the car, outside, on the couch, at the dinner table, in bed.

For Preschool-K

ACTIVITY: Where is your favorite place to pray? What is your favorite way to pray? Now, let's say a prayer in your favorite way.

For Grades 1-5

ACTIVITY: Let me tell you about a time when God gave me grace and helped me when I needed it. Can you tell me about a time when God helped you? What is your favorite way to pray? What place will you begin to pray where you never have prayed before?

LEARN


Read Bible: Mark 6:46-52 — Catholic Children's Bible page 1549, 1552



They came to Jericho, and as Jesus was leaving with his disciples and a large crowd, a blind beggar named Bartimaeus son of Timaeus was sitting by the road. When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout, "Jesus! Son of David! Have mercy on me!"

Many of the people scolded him and told him to be quiet. But he shouted even more loudly, "Son of David, have mercy on me!"





So he threw off his cloak, jumped up, and came to Jesus.

"What do you want me to do for you?" Jesus asked him.

"Teacher," the blind man answered, "I want to see again."

"Go," Jesus told him, "your faith has made you well."

At once he was able to see and followed Jesus on the road.

Jericho is one of the oldest cities of the world and was there thousands of years before Jesus was on earth. It has been called the city of palm trees.

DISCUSS & DO



Tell your children you are going to draw something on a piece of paper and they will have to guess what it is ... first with their eyes closed, and then with their eyes open. Use this activity to discuss how hard it is to guess what you are drawing when they cannot see.

For Preschool-K

SAY: It is hard to see what I drew with your eyes closed, isn't it? The blind man in the story could not see. It was like he had his eyes closed. When the blind man asked for help, Jesus helped the man see. Jesus will help us if we pray to him and ask for help

For Grades 1-5

SAY: Was it hard for you to guess my drawing with your eyes closed? Wasn't it so much easier when your eyes were open and you could see? Imagine how hard it must have been for Bartimaeus to be blind all the time. When Jesus came by on the road, Bartimaeus believed that Jesus could cure him and shouted out his name. Like Bartimaeus, Jesus can help us too. We just need to have faith, recognize he is near us, and ask for his help
