During November, we invite you to record the names of family members and loved ones who have died in our **Book of Remembrance** located on the Sacred Heart altar. Take a moment of prayer this month to inscribe their names.

Solemnity of All Saints – Sunday, October 31 and Monday, November 1 This year, the Solemnity of All Saints will be celebrated on Sunday, October 31 and also Monday, November 1st. You will fulfill your Holy Day obligation by attending one of the Sunday Masses but are encouraged to attend on Monday, the Holy Day itself. These are special Masses offered for all parishioners who have died this past year, and all the faithful departed from our families. Our annual Mass for Deceased Children will take place on Wednesday, November 10 at 6 PM. This is a special Mass and ritual to remember children - lost at any age - and for any reason - and to support one another as we embrace these difficult memories. Our special ritual includes the chance to remember children who died in childbirth or due to miscarriage, children who died by abortion, older sons and daughters who died from diseases, accidents, or natural causes. All parishioners are invited to attend and to support one another in prayer. Please consider inviting someone who could be assisted by this special prayer occasion.

Some polls indicate that the public is receptive to assisted suicide. But the same polls show that people's views shift when they learn about its dangers—especially the dangers for those who are poor, elderly, disabled, or without access to good medical care. Consider that, in Oregon and California, some patients' health insurance offered to pay for assisted suicide, but not treatment. And in states where assisted suicide is legal, often no psychiatric evaluation or treatment is required. Additionally, assisted suicide fosters discrimination by creating two classes of people: those whose suicides we spend millions of dollars to prevent and those whose suicides we assist and treat as a positive good.
