Contributing to the Common Good

Calling his disciples to himself, he said to them, "Amen, I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the other contributors to the treasury. For they have all contributed from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood." - Mark 12:41-44

In my teaching career on liturgy and worship, I've often described the foundation of prayer as "an attitude of gratitude" – of knowing that all we have and all that we are is a gift from God. When we choose to give back, whether through our financial resources, volunteered time, or in

direct praise and worship, we are responding to the Giver of All Life. It is God who started the conversation! We respond from what we have been given.

The Widow's Generosity

In this Sunday's Gospel we hear the story of the poor widow who places two small coins into the common treasury after many rich people put in much larger sums. Jesus calls his disciples to teach them the true value of her contribution, which is not determined by actual amount but in reference to her total livelihood. It is a blunt reminder to them and to us

about the real measure of generosity. This story always gives me a pang of Catholic guilt wondering how my stewardship of time, talent and treasure measure up!

There is a second lesson in this story which tends to be overlooked in our current cultural view: what value do we place on the "common good" in relationship to attending to our own needs? Jesus makes clear that the widow has made the greater contribution to the needs of others out of her "attitude of gratitude." It stands in stark contrast to the overemphasis on personal rights we hear about so often in the current media. What would Jesus teach us today?

The Season of Giving Thanks

Fortunately, we are entering a season of Giving Thanks that annually opens our hearts and generous spirits to consider the needs of those less fortunate and the common good. Our upcoming Thanksgiving holiday is a national opportunity to reset priorities.

Locally, this weekend and next, the St. Vincent de Paul Society of our parish will be distributing their Thanksgiving Food Boxes (see page 7 for information.) Our Mercy Teams' "Sack Lunch Outreach" continues to need more families and

couples to Adopt A Mission on a monthly basis. Can you step up again – as so many of you did in the height of the pandemic – to provide this much-needed response to the hungry in our midst? When we each consider our blessings, we know we have much to give in return.



ONLINE GIVING IN 3 EASY STEPS

If you are already using online giving skip step 1 and 2. (if you forgot your user ID or password click the forgot button and a new password will be emailed to you.

STEP 1 - REGISTER

- From OLL website <u>www.ollparish.com</u>
- Click "Giving" in top right navigation bar
- Click on "Give Online via My Own Giving"
- Click on CREATE A NEW ACCOUNT.



• Submit. You will receive an email to confirm your information.

STEP 2 - SET UP PAYMENT METHOD

- Now log into your account, click on MY PAYMENT METHOD.
- You will need to ADD NEW BANK ACCOUNT (if using your checking account)
 OR ADD NEW CREDIT CARD (if using your credit card).
- Provide all the information requested. Then click **SUBMIT**.

STEP 3 – SET UP DONATION

OPTIONS: You can choose multiple funds (RE, Building Maintenance, SVdP)

- Now return to MANAGE MY ACCOUNT and choose GIVE A NEW GIFT.
- Choose OFFERTORY (fund), then select gift type RECURRING.
- Select payment and frequency and start date.
- Select the account (check or credit card), then enter amount and frequency.
- Click **NEXT** (at the bottom of the page)
- In the CONFIRM MY GIFTS window, review the details to insure all is correct.
 Click SUBMIT.

November - The Month of All Souls



November is the Month of All Souls, a time when we honor parishioners, family members, friends and loved ones who have died in the past year, and all the faithful departed. The **Remembrance Scrolls** that hang in the church include the names of parishioners who passed away this past year and whose funerals we celebrated as a community.

One of the blessings of our Catholic faith is our belief in the Communion of Saints. We state that belief in either the Nicene or Apostles' Creed each time we are at Mass. Through Jesus's life, death and resurrection we are united, in the Mystical Body of Christ, with all those who have gone before us in the faith. Our cherished memories of loved ones and those whose faith brought us to the faith are reminders of our continuing connection through, with and in Christ.

We encourage you to record your loved ones' names in our **Book of Remembrance** which is located on the Sacred Heart altar in the east transept of the church. We encourage you to take a moment of prayer during the month – to inscribe the names of anyone you wish to particularly remember. As you inscribe their names, say a prayer for their souls, and ask their intercession for you and your family.

Eternal Rest Prayer

The following prayer can be said for a particular person, or for several. You can insert a name, or make it a general prayer.

Eternal rest grant unto (name) them O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May their souls, and all the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God rest in peace. Amen.

Our annual Mass for Deceased Children will take place on Wednesday, November 10 at 6 PM. This is a special Mass and ritual to remember children - lost at any age - and for any reason - and to support one another as we embrace these difficult memories. All parishioners are invited to attend and to support each other in prayer.


