This Christmas Let's Get Real

The problems our world faces right now are very real. We need a Savior. And perhaps more than ever.

However, as our world grows more secular it seems that fewer people are focused on spiritual realities. In fact, some would even say that "such things are not real". But today's celebration of Christmas provides a stark contrast to disbelief. We don't just proclaim a spiritual Savior who is outside our experience. Today we proclaim that God became flesh to save our soul and body. Jesus was born as a human being.

God was born into our reality so that we could connect with his reality. The Gospel writers took note of the historical, political and cultural realities of that exact time and place. (Luke 1:5 and Luke 2:1-5) They consulted with eyewitnesses to make sure that they were giving an accurate account of what actually happened. (Luke 1:2) This is not some fabricated, fictitious, made-up story. Rather, this event is Truth itself.

Jesus was born to us in order to teach us about the fullness of life; a full life that he desires for each of us.

His impact was so global that everyone in the world marks time by the calendar that centers on the day of his birth.

When he says that he is God, we need to take him at his word.

Otherwise, as C.S. Lewis remarked, we must consider him either a liar or a lunatic. If neither of those are true, then he must be LORD.

So let's get real.

If Jesus is really God, then we need to listen to him. He provides real hope and a plan for us that the world cannot give. I encourage you to read the bible, participate in Mass, and pray daily. Let your life and your love of others be inspired by the fact that:

Today is born for us a Savior. He is Christ the Lord! (Luke 2:11)




