The Baptism of the Lord

Living Our Baptism

Today the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Baptism of Our Lord. This brings to an end the Christmas season and recalls Our Lord's second manifestation or "epiphany" which occurred on the occasion of His baptism in the Jordan.

Fittingly, our first reading this weekend takes us right back to the words of the prophet Isaiah we heard in Advent: "A voice cries out: In the desert prepare the way of the Lord! Make

straight in the wasteland a highway for our God!" (Isaiah 40:1) Our preparations for and then celebrations of Christ's birth lead us directly to our baptismal mission to proclaim God's reign and presence in the world as disciples.

I was thinking about the power of Baptism as I reflected on the tumultuous events of the past year and the troubled waters of our current world situation. I am thirsting for the planet to be healed of pandemic and I am parched for civil

discourse. Even as the Oregon rains continue in these winter days, I remember too well the smoke and haze of forest fires and civil unrest across the nation. But I place my trust in the Lord for: "God indeed is my savior; I am confident and unafraid." (Isaiah 12:2)

As Jesus comes to the Jordan to be baptized, one of the first elements of creation fashioned by the Father through the Son, is now re-created through the Incarnate Son. Jesus, the Incarnate Word, stands in the waters of the earth which was created through Him. It is an incredible scene: The Spirit hovering like a dove over Jesus, and a voice from heaven declaring: "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." (Luke 3:22)

As we hear these words – you are my beloved – may we take strength for the new year that God's love continues

to transform and recreate the world and each one of us through Christ. May our thirst for healing, peace and restoration be refreshed by our awareness that God's love continues to surround us, even in darkest times.

At Mass this weekend, we will be reminded of our own baptism – perhaps taking place in recent years or many years ago as infants. In that sacramental moment we were invited to follow Jesus. Will we allow His will to "be done

in me" as our Blessed Mother declared to the Angel Gabriel? As we conclude this Christmas season, we are challenged to live our baptism and to grow deeper in our commitment to love and serve the Lord. Through, with and in Christ, may we be the water that quenches thirst for those in need.


Family Faith Formation Yes, we have just Celebrated Christmas, but Lent is just around the corner!



January 28-30, 2022


Retreat Begins with Abbey Vespers Friday at 5:20 PM and concludes with lunch on Sunday at Noon.
