Venerable Father Augustus Tolton

(1854-1897)

Father Tolton, a son of slaves, became the first ordained African American priest from the United States.
Undeterred by racial prejudice from laity and clergy, he ultimately established a highly successful ministry to Black Catholics in Chicago.

Servant of God Sister Thea Bowman

(1937-1990)

Raised in a segregated South, this granddaughter of a slave converted to Catholicism at nine. As a writer, teacher, musician and evangelist, Sr. Bowman directed her skills to healing society and the Church of the wounds of racism.
