Christian Hope and Hospitality

Then I, John, saw a new heaven and a new earth. The former heaven and the former earth had passed away, and the sea was no more. The One who sat on the throne said, "Behold, I make all things new."

-Revelation 21:1,5a

This hopeful passage from the Book of Revelation is a balm for our ears in these days as we try to recover from the isolation of the pandemic. The first disciples faced the trials of building community in the midst of persecution and uncertainty. Though our circumstance is not as grave, we still find ourselves needing to "rebuild" a spirit of hospitality and being community – in person – as we gather again for Mass and parish events. How can you make a difference?

Hospitality Beyond Coffee and Donuts

Last weekend we relaunched "coffee and donuts" hospitality after the Sunday morning Masses. It was a hopeful sign to see parishioners enjoying a social moment again. The value of this time is more than providing a refreshment after Mass. Surveys and research reveal that the main reason people

"attend" church is to gain a sense of meaning and belonging in their lives. The experience of worship in person cannot be duplicated through livestream. Our broadcasts were necessary during the pandemic, but they don't bring people together and are not interactive. So, after Mass hospitality is a critical way to re-establish who we are as a community of faith-filled people following our Lord. Can you help build up the Body of Christ?

When Can You Serve?

We still need more volunteers to sign up and serve a periodic shift on Sundays. Helping with coffee and donuts is an opportunity to meet and greet visitors, welcome returning parishioners, and rebuild a sense of belonging to a community of believers. Consider serving as a couple or family – everyone can find a role. You are part of "something more" through conversation, connecting, and camaraderie. There are four shifts each Sunday so plenty of options.

RESPECT FOR LIFE

USCCB Pro-Life Chairman Urges Faithful to Pray in Response to Leak of Draft Supreme Court Opinion in Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization

Washington – In response to the leak of a draft opinion in the Supreme Court case of Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization, Archbishop William E. Lori of Baltimore, chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' (USCCB) Committee on Pro-Life Activities issued the following call to prayer:

"The leak related to the U.S. Supreme Court case of Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization reminds us of the urgent need for prayer and action at this pivotal moment in our country.

"As Catholics, we care about every unborn child and every mother. Our Church has consistently witnessed in word and deed that life begins at the moment of conception. As the bishops shared in our statement Standing with Moms in Need: we pledge 'to redouble our efforts to accompany women and couples who are facing unexpected or difficult pregnancies, and during the early years of parenthood, offering them loving and compassionate care through initiatives such as Walking with Moms in Need and countless others.'

"At the same time, as we await the Court's decision, we urge everyone to intensify their prayer and fasting that the final decision of the Court will bring about the reversal of Roe and Casey.

"We hope and pray for a change in our laws and stand ready to help all pregnant women in need in each of our communities." -www.USCCB.org

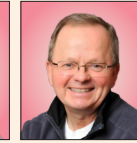
