The Ascension of the Lord

When (Jesus) had said this, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight. (Two men dressed in white) said, "Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky? This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven will return in the same way as you have seen him going into heaven."

Acts 1:10-11

Many people who have returned to life after "near death" experiences describe being surrounded by brilliant light and having a complete sense of peace. Do you imagine heaven as a physical place, a state of being, or some other embodiment of time or space? Of course, we can't really know what heaven is or will be like but the promise of eternal life with

the Risen Lord Jesus is the essence of our faith. We say that our union with Christ here in the Eucharist is a "foretaste" of that heavenly banquet.

This weekend we hear the scriptural "bookends" of the beginning of the Acts of the Apostles and the final passage of St. Luke's Gospel. They are two versions of the same eyewitness account described by the same author, St. Luke. The disciples witnessed Jesus being "taken up" into heaven and were assured of his return by the angels. We are asked to be witnesses to Jesus' resurrection *by faith, not by sight* – a task made significantly more difficult in today's post-Christian culture.

Giving Witness to Life

We recently reached the unimaginable milestone of over one million deaths from COVID. We have seen the disturbing images of death in Ukraine,

Buffalo, and mass shooting incidents which numb our senses and ability to understand why. Our prayers go out to the families of victims, and we continue to pray for peace, but how do we uphold life and give witness to the promise of heaven in our own circle of influence? Like the first disciples, we must stop "looking to the heavens" and find our own strength to proclaim life and the Good News.

The Power and Presence of the Eucharist

Jesus never asked for our worship but instead offered us His ongoing presence in the Holy Eucharist. We need



His strength and sustenance for the journey of faith and to be His witnesses in our circle of family, friends, and community. We need the gift of parish community as well as the parish community needs each one of us – all generations of faith. If you've been away too many weekends, consider this a gentle nudge to return to a more regular attendance at Sunday Mass. We need your presence to be fully the community of disciples.

This weekend, as we honor those who have sacrificed their lives for our freedoms, may we consider our own call to uphold life. As St. Paul reminds us this Sunday: "*Let us hold unwaveringly to our confession that gives us hope.*" (Hebrews 10:23)

Throughout the Easter season, Fr. Kerns has been reflecting in his homilies about the awesome gift we



Euthanasia/Physician Assisted Suicide

"Whatever its motives and means, direct euthanasia consists in putting an end to the lives of handicapped, sick, or dying persons. It is morally unacceptable. Thus an act or omission which, of itself or by intention, causes death in order to eliminate suffering constitutes a murder gravely contrary to the dignity of the human person and to the respect due to the living God, his Creator. The error of judgment into which one can fall in good faith does not change the nature of this murderous act, which must always be forbidden and excluded." —Catechism of the Catholic Church 2277

Facts About Oregon Physician Assisted Suicide

Did you know that in 2021 there were 383 lethal prescriptions, and at least 238 drug-induced deaths – more than twice the number in 2014, and over fifteen times the drug-induced deaths in the law's first full year?

Did you know that all reporting about doctorassisted deaths is self-reported by the doctors prescribing lethal drugs? Doctors have often been members of, or close collaborators with, "Compassion and Choices" (formerly The Hemlock Society), which adamantly supports assisted suicide and promoted the state laws.

Did you know it is "unknown" whether any health care provider was present when the drugs were ingested in almost half of all cases occurring since 2001, when this question began being asked of prescribing physicians?

Did you know that doctors prescribing lethal doses list the underlying illness as the cause of death on

death certificates?

Did you know that from 1998 to 2019, only 4% of patients who died by lethal prescription were even referred for evaluation to check for "impaired judgment"?

Did you know that one woman with cancer received doctor-assisted death although she had dementia, was found mentally incompetent by some doctors, and had a grown daughter described as "somewhat coercive" in pushing her toward the lethal prescription?
