Living As the Body of Christ

Brothers and sisters: I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus, on the night he was handed over, took bread, and, after he had given thanks, broke it and said, "This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

1 Corinthians 11:23-24

This weekend, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ (in Latin: *Corpus Christi*), the Real Presence of the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ in the elements of the Holy Eucharist. St. Paul, in his letter to the community at Corinth, gives us the first written account of this sacred memorial, describing what was already a living tradition amongst the disciples, responding to Jesus' instruction at the Last Supper to: "*do this in remembrance of me.*" (Note: St. Paul's account of the Eucharist was written well before the three synoptic Gospels of Mark, Matthew and Luke were transcribed. St. John's Gospel account of the Last Supper focuses on Jesus' washing the disciples' feet and call to service.)

Here St. Paul is admonishing the Corinthians to take seriously the Eucharist's effective re-enactment of Jesus' sacrifice and to observe it with intention and purpose. For some early disciples, it had already become an ordinary festal meal and less an act of dedication and union with Christ. St. Paul's caution reminds us as well that the "new covenant" is sealed by the "death of the Lord until he comes again."

From Livestream to Living the Eucharist

Just as *Corpus Christi* processions take the Holy Eucharist to the streets in traditions around the world, so we might ask: How are we living as the Body of Christ within our families,

communities, country, and world? During the pandemic shutdown we relied on livestream capability to keep us connected to Christ in the Eucharist. I treasured those days of witnessing your "response in action" through the procession of cars with sack lunches, and significant donations to St. Vincent de Paul outreach efforts.

Now, as we have returned to celebrating Mass in person, there is a danger that we might consider the "broadcasts" equal to our physical presence on Sundays. Weekend Mass attendance is half of what was in 2019. That is cause for concern. Like the multitudes in today's Gospel, Jesus still wants to feed us *physically* with the simple gift of bread which becomes his living Body and Blood—nourishing us to live the Eucharist by using our gifts and talents

in service of others. Christ's Real Presence invites *our* real presence in community on Sundays and in everyday action.

OLL Synod Summary Posted

Members of the Pastoral Council summarized responses to the three Synod Reflection Questions which participants made during the parish Synod gatherings in February and March. This summary was submitted to the Archdiocese and

Summer Construction Project Begins!

This week the summer construction project in our Parish Center & School building begins in earnest. Fr. Kerns outlined the reasons and full details in his parishioner letter in March. In addition to a large, safe, and inviting Pre-K classroom in the school, the Pavilion Construction team will complete several improvements throughout the Parish Center. The science lab will be expanded to include space for more rigorous laboratory studies for middle school students. The second floor of the Parish Center will be remodeled to include a total of six middle school classrooms and the return of a K-8 Library! (The library has had to serve as a classroom for several years.)

The reorganization of space in the Parish Center's second floor means that we will be able to return to allowing parishioners to enter the building and go right to the parish offices, without having to be "buzzed in." Parish staff will also have dedicated office space for parish business. The Pre-K classroom will also become available for Sunday childcare during morning Masses.

Safety and Security

All updates will take into consideration the layered safety measures already in effect at OLL such as: the state-of-the-art

air purification system, which received COVID updates in the summer of 2020, and security systems such as locking mechanisms, secured spaces, and reinforced glass where appropriate. These measures continue to be vital to the health and protection of OLL students, families, staff, and parishioners.

Parish Staff Working Remotely

During the construction the parish office will be open to reception

for routine matters, but most of the parish staff will be working remotely. Always best to call ahead if you need to make an appointment or have a question. Of course, school staff are off for the summer break.

Construction will also limit access to the parking lot behind the school building throughout the summer. As always, use caution as you drive through to get to Mass or the parish office.



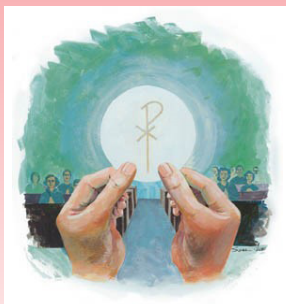
OLL School 8th graders and 2nd grade buddies got to demolish a wall, thanks to Pavilion Construction!

OLL St. Vincent de Paul Update



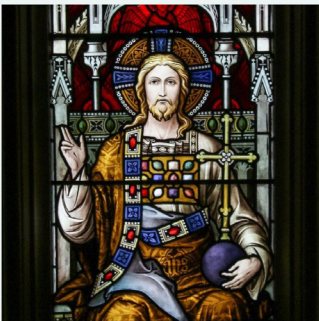
OLL St. Vincent De Paul Conference would like to thank you all for your continued support. Recently we celebrated Pentecost, the official end of our Easter Season. This

Quote from St. Vincent De Paul, "Go to the poor; you will find God."



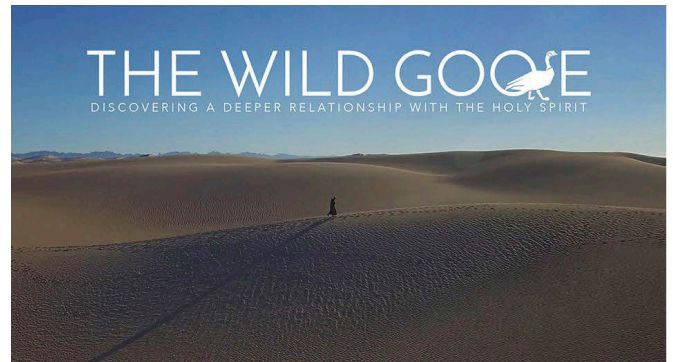
You're Invited! Priestly Ordination

Religious Freedom Week 2022: Life and Dignity for All

Religious freedom allows the Church, and all religious communities, to live out their faith in public and to serve the good of all. Beginning June 22, on the feast of Saints Thomas More and John Fisher, the USCCB invites Catholics to pray, reflect, and act to promote religious freedom.

Saints Thomas More and John Fisher were Renaissance men, talented and energetic. More wrote theological and philosophical treatises, while making a career as a lawyer and government official. Bishop John Fisher worked as an administrator at Cambridge, confronted the challenge Martin Luther presented to Christian Europe, and most importantly served as Bishop of Rochester.

More and Fisher are well-known for opposing King Henry's divorce. Ultimately, it was their refusal to sign an oath of supremacy that led them to be executed. King Henry VIII claimed to be the supreme head of the Church in England, asserting sovereign power over English Christians. Neither Fisher nor More could abide this claim which put them in conflict with the king and they were convicted of treason.

Saints Thomas More and John Fisher show us what faithful citizenship looks like. They loved and served their country. In the moments just before his execution, More is said to have stated, "I die the King's good servant, but God's first." When the law of the king came into conflict with the law of Christ, they submitted to Christ. May their example continue to illuminate the path for us, as we seek to faithfully serve our Church and country.

We ask for the intercession of Saints Thomas More and John Fisher, that we too would be good servants to our country, but God's first!

June 29 - Free Speech: Pray that Christians will have the courage to proclaim the gospel of life and dignity for all with kindness and clarity, even in the face of adversity.

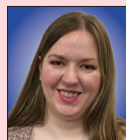
