Celebrating Catholic Schools Week

The week of January 29th through February 4th is National Catholic Schools Week.

his year's theme is "Communities of Faith, Service, Excellence, and each day will have special events to celebrate.

The week starts with Mass on Sunday the 29th. Students who wear their school uniform to Mass will be awarded an exciting "Free Dress Pass" as a thank you for representing the school. Students with Free Dress Passes are allowed to attend school in non-uniform clothes of a day!

Monday's special focus is on celebrating family. Teachers in all grades will take time to reflect and appreciate the blessings of family with their students. Kids will write thank you letters to their parents for blessing them with a Catholic school education.

Tuesday is "Day of the Student." On this day, teachers plan a special treat, game, or activity that shows students how special they are. Students also are allowed to wear sports-related free dress as a thank you from the school.



Wednesday's theme is the day we celebrate Our Lady of the Lake Parish. The school is so well-supported by the parish and it's blessed to be a part of its wider community. To show its appreciation, the school will be hanging a banner in the Parish Center Atrium signed by all the students. In addition, each class will be collecting canned and non-perishable food items to donate to the parish's St. Vincent dePaul food closet.

On Thursday the school is inviting all parents, grandparents, and special family friends to celebrate Mass with our community. After Mass, the Parent Association is providing donuts to each class in the style of the traditional coffee and donuts after Sunday Mass.

To round out the week on Friday, teachers and staff attend an Archdiocesan Faith Formation training and inservice day, then head into the weekend feeling inspired.



The Be-Attitudes of Discipleship

Rejoice and be glad; your reward will be great in heaven. (Matthew 5:12a)

Before the Babylonian Exile, the People of Israel tended to equate material prosperity with divine blessing: those who prospered did so because of the Lord's blessing; those who did not must in some way be blameworthy. The Exile put an end to that way of understanding "blessing" since the whole community was effectively "punished" and thought abandoned by God. They awaited a Messiah.

In his Sermon on the Mount, Jesus sets forth a new way of understanding how we can welcome God into our lives. This passage in St. Matthew's Gospel occurs early in Jesus' ministry and teaching of the disciples. As Bishop Smith pointed out in his homily last Sunday, recall that Matthew was writing his Gospel account primarily for those disciples who came from the Jewish community. So, this way of understanding "blessing" that Jesus proclaims would be particularly meaningful in contrast to their previous beliefs. Jesus provides the blueprint for understanding God's mercy and living out God's blessing.



A Community of Disciples

Jesus came to proclaim the Reign of God, and these are ways

these behaviors in your life and life's work? As we take these

beatitudes to heart and our discipline, we become examples to others of the path to life – following Jesus in word, deed,

of living it. For each of them, do you know someone who

exemplifies the attitude? How have you strived to adopt

and mindset ("having the mind of Christ.")

Like the first disciples, we need a community of believers to help us live out our response to Jesus' invitation. Attending Mass is one important way we respond, but there are other important components of being community. Our parish is also a place where we can first, learn about these ways of living through our formation programs, and experience of the sacraments, particularly the Holy Eucharist. We currently need more parishioners to assist with our religious education and youth ministry efforts. Secondly, our parish community also provides

ways for us to experience and live these attitudes in service and outreach to those in physical need. Our St. Vincent de Paul conference needs new and especially younger parishioners to join their important ongoing outreach. Our parish also provides pastoral care to the homebound and those in hospital settings. How might you make a difference in someone's life by joining this team of volunteers?

The path of discipleship is not easy, but we make the journey together and with joy. After all, as Jesus proclaims, the retirement program is "out of this world!"

The Path of Discipleship

The eight blessing statements describe BE-attitudes, actions, and behaviors that Jesus himself embodied and which he encouraged his disciples to adopt. Throughout the Gospels we hear how Jesus was "poor in spirit" and "meek and merciful"; how he mourned Lazarus and righteously challenged the powers of the day. He was a peacemaker just as he showed mercy to those he healed and the woman at the well. Ultimately, he was persecuted and put to death, achieving our salvation.
