St. Andrew Nativity School –

Providing Catholic High School preparatory education to low income students. Grants have purchased Easter Baskets and Christmas meals for the students and their families. Parishioners give time tutoring students and have done yard cleanups.

Lake Oswego Transitional Shelter

- OLL has supported this Ecumenical Ministry since its inception in 1988. Together with 6 other Lake Oswego faith communities and Clackamas County Department of Social Services, volunteers have worked to provide 2 transitional apartments

and support for the families.

Hispanic Ministry - West Portland Vicariate - OLL along with 6 other churches pool our resources to support the Hispanic community locally. St Anthony provides most of the services.

The one-page grant application is available on the Parish website (Parish Life > Serve Others) or ollparish.com/love-others. Grant requests over \$1,000 require a financial statement from the charitable organization.

This Is the Body of Christ

During this liturgical season of Ordinary Time before Lent, we take the opportunity to introduce new songs for our music repertoire at Mass that are now in our *Breaking Bread* hymnal. Last week we featured a new song for the Communion procession at the 9 and 11am Masses, “*This Is the Body of Christ*”—a poetic hymn from composer, Sarah Hart, that speaks of our unity in community as we receive our precious Lord. The song reflects on the mystery and miracle of God’s presence and offers our thanksgiving for God’s love. In his Sermon on the Mount that we continue to hear these weeks, Jesus describes the way to live out and respond to God’s blessing. During Communion, as we process toward receiving the Body of Christ, the Real Presence of God’s love, may we be filled with joy and thanksgiving.

Lenten Preview

Lent is more than ashes, fish fries and giving up chocolate. It's about bring Hope, Mercy and Grace to our Lives. Lent equips us to share the Good News and to participate in Christ's mission of evangelization. Many of our grandchildren, children and neighbors are skeptics. Even some of us, here in the pews, are not certain why we are here. Let us take the time together to equip ourselves for the mission field. We encourage you to form your own Lenten mission team to journey on our Lenten pilgrimage with the **Sycamore** program together or travel solo. Below are the 6 session topics.

Session 1: The Existence of God

Why bother thinking about religion? Five reasons not to believe in God. Arguments for the existence of God?

Session 2: Who is Jesus?

He came to bring life to the world. The Saving Death of Jesus. The light of the Resurrection

Session 3: The Holy Spirit & The Church

How the Holy Spirit can change your life. No one gets into heaven alone. Why we need signs, symbols and sacraments.

Session 4: The Gift of Faith

What is faith? Are Christians just stupid or are there good reasons to believe? How to take a step of faith.

Session 5: Finding True Freedom

Is there such a thing as right and wrong? Where can we find moral guidance? How do you discover your true identity?

Session 6: The Meaning of Love

What is love? How to love your neighbor. Knowing the love of God.
