Reflection

- 1. What would you say to Jesus if He was right here with you? Well, in the Eucharist He is, so you can say it.
- 2. Take a moment to think about the blessings in your life—family, friends, health, food, etc. Thank God for those things.
- 3. What are some things that you wish could be different? Pray to God, knowing that He hears you and wants what is best for you.
- 4. Remember that Jesus sacrificed Himself for you so that you can be with God forever. Think about that and thank Him.
- 5. Take a moment to reflect on your recent thoughts, words, and actions. When did you show love? When could you have been more loving?
- 6. During the Confirmation journey, are you struggling to believe or accept anything? Ask Jesus to increase your faith and to give you understanding.
- 7. Take time to be silent and simply enjoy Jesus's presence.
