The Month of the Rosary

ctober is the Month of the Rosary needed counting devices, which the rosary together as a group or as a Rosary, an annual opportunity to pray and give more attention to this contemplative spiritual practice. The rosary can be recited in group settings, with one or more persons taking turns leading individual decades. As an individual prayer, the rosary is an any-time, any-where chance to pray and mediate on God's continuing presence in your life.

The exact origin of the Rosary as a prayer is less than clear and subject to debate among scholars. The use of knotted prayer ropes in Christianity goes back to the Desert Fathers in the 3rd and early 4th centuries. These counting devices were used for prayers such as the Jesus prayer in Christian monasticism. The period after the First Council of Ephesus in 431 witnessed gradual growth in the use of Marian prayers during the Middle Ages by lay people as well.

According to some Catholic traditions, the Rosary was given to Saint Dominic in a vision of the Blessed Virgin Mary and it was then promoted by Blessed Allan de la Roche. Some historians see a more gradual development for the Rosary, in that the repetition of Marian resulted in the modern form of the family also provides the daily or weekly Rosary prayed on beads.



The practice of meditation during the praying of the Hail Mary's is attributed to Dominic of Prussia, a 15th-century Carthusian monk, who called it the "Life of Jesus Rosary." In 2002 Pope John Paul II introduced the five Luminous Mysteries.

Why Pray the Rosary?


There are many spiritual approaches to praying the rosary both individually and in groups. For example, praying


discipline to maintain a prayer practice. Praying the Rosary in the evening or just before bed helps to provide a perspective on the day and a sense of peace about life's difficult moments. Many people find that praying the rosary while driving-either a longer distance, or in commuting to or from work, allows time to re-focus their heart and mind and renew their spirit for the day. It's also pretty difficult to succumb to "road rage" while reciting a Hail Mary!



OLL Prayer Shawl Ministry "Threads of Comfort"



ur Lady of the Lake Parish is entering an exciting and bold chapter in our ministries and history. After much prayer and discernment, we are embarking on a major remodel and renovation project for our church and parish hall that will breathe new life into our facilities and enhance our ability to serve our community of faith.

Building Our Future: A Sacred Presence

Here are several design components being addressed by the campaign which launched on October 12-13 after all Masses with town hall meetings and presentations. Each week we will highlight other components.

Church Entrance: We worked with our architects to ensure that every parishioner and visitor would feel welcomed as they arrive for Mass or events. The new, added vestibule will offer a clear and welcoming entrance, with beautiful wide staircase that invites everyone up into the church—our spiritual home. This larger entrance from the parking lot will also serve as a gathering space before and after Mass.

Parish Hall Kitchen: The kitchen is the heart of any home. With that in mind, we created a user-friendly kitchen with zones for prep and service, cooking and dishwashing. We also have added ample storage within the kitchen so various ministries including Funeral Luncheons, Knights of Columbus, faith-sharing groups, and After Mass Hospitality all have access to what they need to serve our community.

Parish Hall Updates: Our renewed Parish Hall will serve as the hub for community activities and feature updated lighting, flooring, restrooms, storage areas, and audio-visual capabilities. The hall design includes additional entrances from the vestibule, increased natural lighting, two smaller conference rooms, updated storage for tables, chairs, and designated workspace for St. Vincent de Paul and Mercy Teams outreach ministries.

- 3. **Family Meals** delivered to food insecure families—Made up by Costco and distributed prior to Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter. Each distribution serves around 100 families.
