An Attitude of Gratitude

Calling his disciples to himself, he said to them, "Amen, I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the other contributors to the treasury. For they have all contributed from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood."

Mark 12:41-44

In my teaching career on liturgy and worship, I've often described the foundation of prayer as "an attitude of gratitude"—of knowing that all we have and all that we are is a gift from God. When we choose to give back, whether through our financial resources, volunteered time, or in direct praise and worship, we are responding to the Giver of All Life. It is God who started the conversation! We respond from what we have been given.

The Widow's Generosity

In this Sunday's Gospel we hear the story of the poor widow who places two small coins into the common treasury after many rich people put in much larger sums. Jesus calls his disciples to teach them the true value of her contribution, which is not determined by actual amount but in reference to her total livelihood. It is an important reminder to them and to us about the real measure of generosity. This story always gives me a pang of Catholic guilt wondering how my stewardship of time, talent and treasure measure up!

There is a second lesson in this story which tends to be overlooked in our current cultural view: what priority do we place on *loving our neighbor* in relationship to attending to our own needs? Jesus makes clear that the widow has made the greater contribution to the needs of others out of her "attitude of gratitude." When we begin with the understanding that all that we have, including the gift of life, comes from God, then the needs of the larger community of all God's children and creation come into right perspective.


The Season of Giving Thanks

A message from Fr. John:

Many parishioners have asked if we will bring back the offering of the chalice at Mass for all parishioners to have the option of receiving the Precious Blood of Christ. Recently, Archbishop Sample has issued a document called *Holy Communion Under Both Kinds* (see link below). After consultation with the Presbyteral Council (a representative body of priests in the archdiocese) he has announced that we will not



be offering the chalice to parishioners in general. But it can be offered in special circumstances, such as, for the bride and groom at their nuptial Mass, or children when receiving their First Holy Communion, for the newly confirmed at their Confirmation Mass, or for those with special medical needs who, for health reasons, cannot receive the Body of Christ even in the form of a low-gluten host.

The main reasons given for the decision are to exercise the greatest of caution to avoid spilling the Precious Blood (referred to as “profanation”, or mishandling of the Blessed Sacrament, even if accidental) and because most of the

global Church does not offer the Precious Blood to the Eucharistic assembly (congregation). The document also emphasizes the theological understanding that the fullness of the Body and Blood of Christ are received completely, even under one form. That has always been true.



The document lists several special circumstances where the chalice can be offered in addition to those named above: on a retreat for those making the retreat, for adults who are newly baptized at the Easter Vigil, and for members of the religious community at a “conventual” or community Mass. For example, the monks at Mount Angel Abbey i.e., professed members of their community, receive communion from the chalice, but not the general assembly.

I encourage you to read the document which can be found at the link below to gain a better understanding of the Archbishop’s decision. It also provides teaching on the amazing gift we have in the Blessed Sacrament.





We will be closed Monday, November 11, in honor of Veterans' Day. We will return to normal hours on Tuesday, November 12.




Coping With Grief During the Holidays

"God is Good" - by Alejandro

I am so thankful for the heart-touching trip. Samaritan Purse Team through Grant Construction contacted me and asked if I could join for a service trip to Louisiana to provide support to the Hurricane disaster area. I had 72 hours to prep and pack. We took a red-eye flight, arrived at 7am, and went straight to the disaster site. Work

started at 8am and lasted past dinner. My team tarped roofs, pulled wet insulation and sheetrock out of flooded houses, sawed up fallen trees, reframed the upper level on homes, and prepped for the next crew to come in and lay out the roofing.

The area was devastated. The families were desperate and so thankful to see us. We slept on mats in a church, and ate meals donated by churches. Seeing so many people pull together to help put these families back into their homes was amazing. Many of them had nothing left.

My team's foreman knows a bit of American Sign Language, but the Samaritan's Purse coordinator said I was the first Deaf carpenter they had ever met.

I returned home feeling very blessed. I have a wonderful home. I have friends and family. I have my church. I have clothes, food, and a new job starting up with Grant Company. God is good.


