## The Lord has done great things for us.

Psalm 126:3

s we prepare for the seasons of Advent and Christmas, this verse from Psalm 126 resounds with a timeless truth. It invites us, as our Entrance Antiphon each Advent Sunday, to reflect on the great things God has done from the beginning of time, through biblical times, as well as in our own time... for us!

Advent is a season of anticipation, a time of looking forward to the coming of Christ. It mirrors the longing of the Israelites, who awaited the Messiah with hope. In our waiting, we reflect on the great things God has done throughout all time, recognizing God's hand in the fabric of our lives.

Christmas, the celebration of Christ's birth, is the fulfillment of that anticipation. It is the ultimate "great thing" the Lord has done for us-sending His Son to be with us, to teach us, and to save us. recognize the profound gift we've received.

As we light the Advent candles, let us be mindful of the light of Christ that has come into the world. Let us remember that no matter the challenges or sorrows we face, we are a people who have seen a great light. Our God is a God of restoration, of hope, and who offers us eternal life.

In this spirit, may we embrace the call to be bearers of this Good News in the world, showing through our actions that the Lord continues to do great things for us. Let us prepare our hearts to receive Him anew, with gratitude for His countless blessings.

May we carry the joy of this verse in our hearts during these liturgical seasons, remembering that the Lord indeed has done great things for us. May this awareness fill us with gratitude and joy, guiding us to share His love and blessings with others.



#### Advent: The Church's New Year

Our prayer life is important to forming us as disciples. Like traditional "new year's resolutions," we might use these Advent days to recalibrate our spiritual attentiveness. Our parish community is ready to help and offers a variety of opportunities to refocus.

#### Daily Mass and Open Church

We are blessed to be able to provide daily Mass at 8:30am every weekday, also at 6:30am on Wednesdays and Thursdays, and 6:00pm on Tuesdays. During Advent, consider adding a weekday Mass or visit to the Blessed Sacrament in our church which is open during the day. Join the community of parishioners who already keep this prayerful discipline. First Friday Eucharistic Adoration will take place on Friday, December 6th including a Holy Hour of prayer from 6-7pm concluding with Benediction.

#### Little "Blue" Books for Advent and Christmas

Our parish has purchased a limited number (300) of the Little "Blue" Books with daily Advent and Christmas reflections that are now available in the church narthex. "Little Books of the Diocese of Saginaw" is also an app that you can download for phone or tablet for a nominal cost. The reflections on the app carry through the entire year.

#### **Advent Giving Trees**

Last week we announced our Advent Giving trees that are now displayed in the church narthex, parish hall entrance, and parish center lobby. The tags identify gifts or gift cards you can purchase and return to the trees by December 21 so they can be distributed to the various agencies that serve the families in need.



TO ALL WHO READ THIS LETTER MAY HOPE FILL YOUR HEARTS

1. SPES NON CONFUNDIT. "Hope does not disappoint" (Rom 5:5). In the spirit of hope, the Apostle Paul addressed these words of encouragement to the Christian community of Rome. Hope is also the central message of the coming Jubilee that, in accordance with an ancient tradition, the Pope proclaims every twenty-five years. My thoughts turn to all those pilgrims of hope who will travel to Rome in order to experience the Holy Year and to all those others who, though unable to visit the City of the Apostles Peter and Paul, will celebrate it in their local Churches. For everyone, may the Jubilee be a moment of genuine, personal encounter with the Lord Jesus, the "door" (cf. Jn 10:7.9) of our salvation, whom the Church is charged to proclaim always, everywhere and to all as "our hope" (1 Tim 1:1).

Everyone knows what it is to hope. In the heart of each person, hope dwells as the desire and expectation of good things to come, despite our not knowing what the future may bring. Even so, uncertainty about the future may at times give rise to conflicting feelings, ranging from confident trust to apprehensiveness, from serenity to anxiety, from firm conviction to hesitation and doubt. Often we come across people who are discouraged, pessimistic and cynical about the future, as if nothing could possibly bring them happiness. For all of us, may the Jubilee be an opportunity to be renewed in hope. God's word helps us find reasons for that hope. Taking it as our guide, let us return to the message that the Apostle Paul wished to communicate to the Christians of Rome.

#### RESPECT LIFE

#### **Late-Term Abortions More Than Doubled in 2023, OHA Data Shows**

Last Friday, we received some disturbing and disheartening news and data about current Oregon abortion rates from OHA. Oregon Health Authority's finalized 2023 abortion records show dramatically increased abortion rates in numerous categories, including a sharp rise in the number of late-term abortions compared to the prior year. The statistics paint a stark picture of the state's radical abortion landscape and signal a growing need for pro-life Oregonians to counter the extremism promoted by pro-abortion politicians and the abortion lobby. (ortl.org/2024/11/ <u>late-term-abortions-more-than-doubled-</u> in-2023-oha-data-shows).

Last week, Oregon Health Authority (OHA) updated its 2023 abortion records. The data show that Oregon abortion providers performed the highest number of abortions in a single year since 2009. 10,075 unborn lives were violently ended through abortion last year compared to 8,672 in 2022, a 16.2% increase.

225 of them were 23 weeks gestational age or older, meaning they were welldeveloped and may have been able to survive outside the womb. In 2022, that number was 85. That's a 165% increase in late-term abortions in 2023 compared to the prior year.

1,661 abortions were performed for women who traveled to Oregon from out of state, compared to 1,036 in 2022—a 60% increase. 381 of those outof-state resident abortions occurred in Eastern Oregon's Malheur County, where Planned Parenthood opened a clinic to prey on women from our prolife neighbor, Idaho. Malheur County had no reported abortions in 2022. These numbers are heartbreaking.

The 225 tiny, innocent, pain-capable human beings who suffered lateterm abortions last year experienced either cardiac arrest or brutal dismemberment at the hands of Oregon's abortion providers. Abortion is legal in Oregon up to the moment of birth.

Radical politicians and the abortion lobby like to try to convince people that late-term abortions don't happen. But the Oregon Health Authority data show that isn't true.

In the last few years, in all the prolife public talks I have given, I always

include how pro-abortion advocates said, " Our goal has never been to are trying to make Oregon, especially Portland, an abortion tourism state, especially late-term abortion due to our laws. Unfortunately, it looks like is becoming true as the data suggests with the 60% increase in women who traveled to Oregon for an abortion in 2023. We must not let our state of Oregon become a sanctuary of death.

We MUST TAKE ACTION and INCREASE OUR EFFORTS for a culture of life here in Oregon. Here are some direct ways we can advocate for life:

**PRAY** - we must never underestimate the power of prayer. It will win the game. Commit to a regular Holy Hour of Adoration for an end to abortion, 12/7 The St. Pius X Knights of especially here in Oregon.

Sidewalk advocacy and prayer - we know that sidewalk advocacy and prayer work. Campaigns like 40 Days for Life have incredible statistics on how many lives are saved and how many abortion workers quit. Planned Parenthood reported at a national convention of theirs, that there is as high of a 70% no show rate when people are praying outside their abortion facilities. We have year-round sidewalk advocacy and prayer vigils in Portland. Please contact Therese Ruesink for more information and to get involved at ruesinktherese55@ amail.com

**Support** - Pregnancy Resource Centers and Maternity Homes

Parishes & Pulpit - Pastors, talk about and promote a culture of life. Discuss what is happening with life issues in our state of Oregon and encourage parishioners to get involved. Equip your parish with the knowledge of pregnancy help resources. As a parish, participate in the USCCB's parish program, Walking with Mom's in Need.

Education- Theology of the Body, NFP, Sisters for Life School Curriculums

**Legislative**- Oregon Right to Life is our biggest legislative pro-life advocate in Oregon and brought us the news that I share with you today. They do excellent work for life in our state. Support them HERE.

**Heal**- support the good work of our local Oregon's Project Aurora who provides Rachel's Vineyard retreats and resources for post-abortive women to heal from the trauma of abortion.

**Discuss** - have these difficult yet very important conversations with your family and friends around the dinner table or wherever is best. We compassionately have these conversations with others who may not be pro-life. As Archbishop Sample

While this news about Oregon's current abortion rates is not good, we take hope in the knowledge that God is the Victor and He always defeats
