Pope Francis' chosen coat of arms is one of simplicity.

The symbols on the shield—the mitre at top, the crossed gold and silver keys bound by the red cord—are the same used by Pope Francis' Predecessor, Benedict XVI.

The shield's radiant sun is the emblem of the Pope's religious order—the Society of Jesus. The red letters ("IHS") in the center is the monogram of Jesus; beneath those letters are three black nails.

According to ancient armorial tradition, the star on the shield's lower left symbolizes the Virgin Mary, the Mother of Christ, and the Church. The spikenard symbolizes St Joseph, Patron of the Universal Church. In traditional Hispanic iconography, St Joseph is shown with a vine in his hand. By bearing these images on his shield, the Pope communicates his special devotion to the Most Holy Virgin and to St Joseph.

The motto on Pope Francis' coat of arms, "miserando atque eligendo," is taken from a homily by Saint Bede, an English eighth-century Christian writer and doctor of the Church of the Gospel account of the call of Saint Matthew. It roughly translates to "having mercy, he called him."
