"Brothers and sisters: If you were raised with Christ, seek what is above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ your life appears, then you too will appear with him in glory."

~ Colossians 3:1-4

y name is Nick Eggert, and this is the story of how I became Catholic.

I grew up in a small Minnesota town, raised in

the WELS Lutheran tradition. But the faith never quite settled in my heart. By my teenage years, I had walked away entirely. I called myself an atheist—not out of anger, but because I didn't see the point in believing something that didn't feel true.

Then I became a husband and a father. In 2020, as the world shook around me, I started to feel the cracks in my certainty. I didn't just want to be a good man—I wanted to know what was true. If God was real, I needed to find Him.

What shook me most were the martyrs.

These weren't legends. They were real people—men and women recorded in history—who chose unspeakable pain and death rather than deny Christ. I couldn't stop asking: Who suffers like that for something they know is a lie?

That question wouldn't leave me alone.

And even once I knew I was being drawn to the Church, the path wasn't easy. Catholicism didn't offer comfort first—it offered truth. Discipline. Sacrifice. Mass every Sunday, confession, obedience, surrender. It wasn't easy. It still isn't. But the struggle has been good. It's been holy.

One Sunday, while my family was out of town—what I now call divine setup—I nervously walked into Our Lady of the Lake. I sat in the back, hoping to blend in. And of course, Fr. John found me.

"Are you Catholic?" he asked.

"No," I said. "But I think I want to be."

He introduced me to Matt Williams, who became my sponsor and walked with me every step of the way.

Later I learned that my first Mass was on June 30th—the Feast of the First Martyrs of the Church of Rome.

Of course, it was.

Becoming Catholic has reordered my life. It's demanded more of me than I expected—and offered more peace than I thought possible. I'm so grateful to Fr. John, to Matt, and to all of you here at OLL for welcoming me the moment I finally walked through the door.

I came in with questions. I found truth. I came in alone. I found a home.



About the Order of Christian Initiation (OCIA)

The OCIA meets on Wednesday evenings beginning mid-September, exploring the four pillars of the Catholic Faith; What We Believe, How We Worship, How We Live, and How We Pray. The Catholic Church honors your intellect and your will by providing you with information and time to discern your own walk with God. We are here to walk beside you. Those who are not yet baptized and choose to enter the church will be baptized at an Easter Vigil. Baptized Christians are generally confirmed in the Catholic faith at the Easter vigil but may also be confirmed at any Catholic Mass at a time when they are prepared to enter the church.

Equally important to our mission is for our OLL "On Call"


Vincentians to respond immediately to requests for assistance with utility or rent payments. Our assistance can only be done through the generous donations made by our parishioners.

The choir loft, balcony will mostly come down so that a new, more spacious one, with safer access, will take its place. But the organ pipes will remain for the new organ.

Sisters of Life: Wonderful Source of Positive Pro-Life Messages and Inspiration

The Sisters of Life are a contemplative/active Roman Catholic community of women religious, who profess the three traditional vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience, and a fourth vow to protect and enhance the sacredness of human life. They were founded by Cardinal John O'Connor in New York in 1991, and received formal approbation as a religious institute in 2004, under Cardinal Edward Egan. They currently serve in the dioceses of New York, Albany, Bridgeport, Philadelphia, Denver, Phoenix, Washington, DC, and Toronto.

Their missions include serving women who are vulnerable to abortion, giving them the support and resources to be able to choose life for themselves and their children; hosting weekend retreats; evangelization; outreach to college students; and helping women who have suffered after abortion to encounter the mercy and healing of Jesus Christ.

The Sisters of Life believe that every person is valuable and sacred; that every person is good, loved, unique, and unrepeatable; that every person's life has deep meaning, purpose, and worth.

They offer a wealth of resources on their website <u>sistersoflife.org</u>, including prayers like the Litany of Trust and Magnificat with Mary; articles such as "What Do I Believe About My Life?"; and a podcast "Let Love." The latest episode of the podcast is Season 17: What's Your Story?" They also offer guidance on end-of-life issues.
